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        14-3-501. Definitions.
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       (a) As used in this article:
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             (i) "Access software provider" means a provider
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   of software, including client or server software, or
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    enabling tools that do any one (1) or more of the
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   following:
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                 (A) Filter, screen, allow or disallow
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   content;
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                 (B) Pick, choose, analyze or digest
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   content;
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                 (C) Transmit, receive, display, forward,
   cache, search, subset, organize, reorganize or translate
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    content.
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            (ii) "Child pornography" means as defined by
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   W.S. 6-4-303(a)(ii);
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1 (iii) "Covered platform" means an entity that 2 operates a website that, in the regular course of business, 3 creates, hosts or makes available content that is material 4 harmful to minors that is provided by the entity, a user or 5 other information content provider for purposes of making a profit. "Covered platform" includes an entity described in 6 this paragraph regardless of whether the entity: 7 8 9 Earns a profit on the activities (A) 10 described in this paragraph; or 11 12 (B) Creates, hosts, or makes available content that is material harmful to minors as the sole 13 14 source of income or principal business of the entity. 15 16 (iv) "Interactive computer service" means any 17 information service, system or access software provider 18 that provides or enables computer access by multiple users 19 to a computer server, including specifically a service or 20 system that provides access to the internet and systems 21 operated or services offered by libraries or educational institutions; 22 23

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1 (v) "Information content provider" means any 2 person that is responsible, in whole or in part, for the 3 creation or development of information provided through the 4 internet or any other interactive computer service; 5 6 (vi) "Material harmful to minors" means any picture, image, graphic image file, film, videotape or 7 8 other visual depiction that is obscene or is child 9 pornography; 10 11 (vii) "Minor" means a person who has not 12 attained the age of eighteen (18) years; 13 14 (viii) "Obscene" means as defined by W.S. 6-4-301(a)(iii); 15 16 17 (ix) "Reasonable age verification measures" include: 18 19 20 (A) A Wyoming driver's license as defined 21 by W.S. 31-7-102(a)(xxv); 22

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1 (B) A Wyoming identification card issued under W.S. 31-8-101; 2 3 4 (C) A valid United States passport; 5 (D) A United States military card; б 7 8 (E) A tribal identification card; 9 10 (F) A driver's license or identification 11 card issued by any state or outlying possession of the United States; 12 13 14 (G) A credit card, except for cards that do not require the person in ownership of the credit card 15 16 account to be eighteen (18) years of age or older; 17 (H) A debit card, except for cards that do 18 19 not require the person in ownership of the debit card 20 account to be eighteen (18) years of age or older; 21

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1 (J) Any other means or method that reliably 2 and accurately can determine whether a user of a covered 3 platform is a minor. 4 14-3-502. Covered platforms with material harmful to 5 minors; age verification; exceptions. б 7 8 (a) Except as otherwise provided in W.S. 14-3-504, 9 any covered platform shall perform reasonable age 10 verification methods to verify the age of all persons accessing or attempting to access the material and shall 11 12 prevent access by minors to the material. 13 14 (b) Any covered platform or third party that performs required age verification shall not 15 the retain any 16 identifying information of the person after access has been 17 granted to the material. 18 19 14-3-503. Covered platforms; verification; age 20 liability; limitations. 21 guardian of a minor 22 (a) Any parent or who is 23 aggrieved by a violation of W.S. 14-3-502 shall have a 6 HB0043

1 cause of action on the minor's behalf against the covered 2 platform that violated W.S. 14-3-502. 3 4 (b) Any person may bring a civil action against a 5 covered platform for knowingly retaining identifying information of the person after access to the material 6 harmful to minors has been granted to the person in 7 8 violation of W.S. 14-3-502. 9 10 (c) Any covered platform that violates W.S. 14-3-502 shall be liable to a person for damages, including those 11 12 defined in this section, court costs and reasonable 13 attorney fees. 14 15 (d) A covered platform that is found to have 16 knowingly retained identifying information of a person in 17 violation of W.S. 14-3-502(b) after access to the covered platform has been granted to the person shall be liable to 18 19 the person for damages for retaining the identifying 20 information, including court costs and reasonable attorney 21 fees.

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1 (e) A plaintiff who brings a successful cause of 2 action under subsection (a) of this section shall, in 3 addition to the damages specified in subsection (c) of this 4 section, receive damages in an amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for each instance that the covered 5 platform failed to perform reasonable age verification б methods to restrict a minor's access to material harmful to 7 minors. For purposes of this subsection, each failure to 8 9 perform age verification shall constitute a separate 10 violation.

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12 (f) A person may bring an action under this section 13 regardless of whether another court has declared any 14 provision of this article unconstitutional unless that 15 court decision is binding on the court in which the action 16 is brought.

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18 (g) No covered platform or information content 19 provider shall be entitled to assert that the outcome of 20 any previous litigation involving other parties, wherever 21 that litigation may have occurred, is a bar to any cause of 22 action authorized by this section.

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(h) Notwithstanding any other provision of law:

3 (i) Violations of W.S. 14-3-502 shall be 4 enforced exclusively through the civil actions provided in 5 this section;

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7 (ii) No direct or indirect enforcement of this 8 article shall be taken or threatened by the state or any 9 other political subdivision of the state against any person 10 in any manner whatsoever except as provided in this 11 section.

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13 (j) Except as provided in subsection (k) of this section, any waiver, purported waiver or estoppel of a 14 15 person's right to bring an action as provided under this 16 section shall be void as unlawful and against public policy. No court or arbitrator shall enforce or give effect 17 to a waiver or estoppel, notwithstanding any choice-of-law 18 19 provision or other provision in any contract or other 20 agreement.

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(k) The prohibition in subsection (j) of this sectionshall not apply to contractual waivers to the extent that

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1 the application of the prohibition in subsection (j) of this section would impair a contract or contract obligation 2 3 in violation of the constitutions of the United States or 4 Wyoming. 5 6 14-3-504. Covered platforms; age verification; 7 applicability and exceptions. 8 9 (a) This article shall apply only to minors who: 10 11 (i) Are permanent residents of Wyoming; 12 13 (ii) Have resided in Wyoming for more than one 14 (1) year; or 15 16 (iii) Have been sojourning or present in Wyoming 17 for not less than thirty-one (31) consecutive days. 18 19 (b) This article shall not: 20 21 (i) Apply to any internet service provider, any affiliate or subsidiary of an internet service provider, 22

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1 any general purpose search engine or cloud service
2 provider;

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4 (ii) Subject a covered platform to any cause of 5 action or liability to the extent the covered platform is 6 protected from liability or causes of action under federal 7 law;

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9 (iii) Excuse any person from any other legal 10 duties arising from compliance with this article or relieve 11 any person from any other available legal remedies;

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13 (iv) Apply in cases to the extent the article 14 would violate the commerce clause of the United States 15 Constitution.

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17 (c) Any contract, agreement or other arrangement made 18 or entered in violation of this article shall be contrary 19 to law and public policy and shall be void and 20 unenforceable.

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Section 2. Nothing in this act shall be construed to
 impair or alter any contract, obligation or other agreement
 entered into before the effective date of this act.
 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2025.
