AN ACT relating to education; modifying the education 1 2 savings accounts program; changing the name of the program 3 to the Wyoming freedom scholarship act; creating the 4 Wyoming freedom scholarship program account; modifying distribution of state funds; modifying definitions; 5 increasing the maximum scholarship 6 award; modifying 7 eligibility requirements; repealing provisions; providing 8 appropriations; making conforming amendments; and providing 9 for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 12

1 Section 1. W.S. 9-4-601(a)(ii) is amended to read: 2 9-4-601. Distribution and 3 use; funds, accounts, 4 cities and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments. 5 (a) All monies received by the state of Wyoming from б the secretary of the treasury of the United States under 7 8 the provisions of the act of congress of February 25, 1920 9 (41 Stat. 437, 450; 30 U.S.C. 181, 191), as amended, or 10 from lessees or authorized mine operators and all monies received by the state from its sale of production from 11 12 federal mineral leases subject to the act of congress of 13 February 25, 1920 (41 Stat. 437, 450; 30 U.S.C. 181, 191) as amended, except as provided by subsection (b) of this 14 section, shall be deposited into an account and the first 15 16 two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000.00) of revenues received in any fiscal year shall be distributed by the 17 state treasurer as provided in this subsection. One percent 18 19 (1%) of these revenues shall be credited to the general 20 fund as an administrative fee, and the remainder shall be 21 distributed as follows: 22

18	a new subparagraph (Q), (ii) and (e), 21-2-905(e) and
19	(f)(intro), 21-2-906(a)(i), (iv), (ix), (xi), (xii), by
20	creating a new paragraph (xiii) and by creating new
21	subsections (d) and (e) and 21-2-909, as amended by 2024
22	Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 108, Section 1 and effective
23	January 1, 2025, are amended to read:

3	WYOMING FREEDOM SCHOLARSHIP ACT
4	
5	21-2-901. Short title.
6	
7	This act shall be known as the "Wyoming Education Savings
8	Accounts Freedom Scholarship Act." The program created by
9	this act shall be known as the "ESA program."
10	
11	21-2-902. Definitions.
12	
13	(a) As used in this act:
14	
15	(vii) "Qualified school" means a
16	pre-kindergarten or a nonpublic primary or secondary
17	school, certified by the state superintendent of public
18	instruction pursuant to W.S. 21-2-906(a), located in or
19	that provides education services in this state, that may
20	include through online means;
21	
22	21-2-903. Education savings accounts; Wyoming freedom
23	scholarship program account.

2 (a) For school year 2025-2026, the total amount to be 3 deposited in an education savings account for an ESA 4 student each year shall be determined by the student's household income compared to the federal poverty levels, 5 using the most recent federal poverty guidelines for the 6 student's household size and income, as follows; six 7 8 thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) for students whose household 9 income is at or below one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the federal poverty level seven thousand 10 dollars 11 (\$7,000.00).

(b) Payments to ESAs under this act shall be made by 13 the state superintendent of public instruction from the 14 15 Wyoming education savings accounts expenditure freedom 16 scholarship program account, which is hereby created. The 17 Wyoming education savings accounts expenditure freedom 18 scholarship program account shall consist of funds 19 transferred to the expenditure account and other funds 20 appropriated by the legislature to the expenditure account. All earnings from investment of the expenditure Wyoming 21 freedom scholarship program account shall be credited to 22 the expenditure account. Except as provided by subsection 23

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(c) of this section, any unencumbered, unobligated balance of the expenditure Wyoming freedom scholarship program account at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert but shall remain in the expenditure account and shall be expended to fund ESAs as provided by this act.

7 (c) If at the end of a fiscal year the state 8 superintendent determines the amount in the Wyoming freedom scholarship program account is more than thirty million 9 10 dollars (\$30,000,000.00) and is more than one hundred and 11 fifty percent (150%) of the amount required to fund all 12 approved ESAs for the applicable fiscal year, the state superintendent shall request the state treasurer transfer 13 the excess amount determined under this subsection to the 14 15 public school foundation program account.

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17 Payments to each approved $\left(\frac{c}{d}\right)$ ESA shall be disbursed on a quarterly basis by the state superintendent 18 19 or another state agency or person designated by the state 20 superintendent to administer and disburse funds to 21 education savings accounts.

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1 (e) The ESA program shall not be funded with county, 2 city or school district tax revenues. 3 4 21-2-904. ESA parent agreement; ESA administration. 5 Subject to the availability of funds 6 (a) as determined by the legislature, any child who is a Wyoming 7 meets one (1) of the following 8 resident, who 9 qualifications, and subject to W.S. 21-2-903(a) has not 10 graduated from high school or received a high school 11 equivalency certificate and who is eligible to attend a public school in this state, shall be eliqible to receive 12 an ESA subject to the provisions of this act.+ 13 14 (b) To participate in the ESA program, the custodial 15 16 parent of an ESA student shall sign an agreement with the 17 state superintendent that: 18 Requires use of the ESA funds for the 19 (i) 20 following qualifying expenses to educate the ESA student: 21

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1 (J) Tuition and fees for summer education 2 programs and specialized after school education programs, 3 but not including after school childcare programs; 4 5 (Q) Tuition and fees for nongovernmental 6 online learning programs. 7 (ii) For students eligible for an ESA under 8 9 paragraph (a)(i) of this section: 10 (A) Requires that the ESA student receive 11 instruction in, at minimum, reading, writing, mathematics, 12 civics, including studies of the United States constitution 13 and the constitution of the state of Wyoming, history, 14 15 literature and science and is assessed on academic 16 progress. No parent shall be required to include any 17 instruction that conflicts with the parent's or the ESA student's religious doctrines; 18 19 20 (B) Requires that the ESA student take the 21 statewide assessments administered pursuant to W.S. 21-2-304(a) or a nationally normed achievement exam; 22 23

1 (C)(iii) Certifies that the ESA student is not, 2 or will not be, enrolled in a public school district upon 3 receipt of the ESA and releases the applicable school 4 district from all obligations to educate the ESA student. 5 This subparagraph paragraph shall not: б 7 (I) (A) Require an eligible student to withdraw from a public school district before applying for 8 or receiving an ESA if the student withdraws from the 9 10 public school district before receiving or expending any 11 monies in the student's ESA; 12 13 (II) (B) Prevent a qualified student from applying in advance for an ESA student to be funded 14 beginning the following school year; or 15 16 17 (III)(C) Prevent a public school district from charging an ESA for any services provided to the 18 19 qualified student to the extent authorized by law. 20 21 (e) An ESA shall remain active and any unused funds shall not revert until the parent withdraws the ESA student 22 23 from the ESA program or until the ESA student is no longer

eligible for the ESA program, unless the ESA is closed 1 because of a substantial misuse of funds. When an ESA is 2 3 closed, any unused funds shall revert to the Wyoming 4 education savings accounts expenditure freedom scholarship 5 program account. б 7 21-2-905. Application. 8 9 (e) Except as provided under this subsection, eighty 10 percent (80%) of the ESAs shall be awarded to students 11 eligible pursuant to W.S. 21-2-904(a)(i) and the remaining 12 twenty percent (20%) shall be awarded to students eligible 13 pursuant to W.S. 21-2-904(a)(ii) each year. Any funds 14 allocated under this subsection for the award of ESAs to students eligible pursuant to W.S. 21-2-904(a)(ii) that are 15 16 not awarded in any school year may be awarded to students 17 eligible pursuant to W.S. 21-2-904(a)(i). If the number of applications for ESAs exceeds the available funds for any 18 19 school year, the students shall be selected on а 20 first-come, first-served basis, except preference shall be 21 given to the following students:

1 (i) An eligible student who received funds under 2 the ESA program in the immediately preceding school year;-3 or 4 (ii) A sibling of an eligible student who: 5 6 7 (A) Receives scholarship funds from an ESA 8 at the time the sibling applied for an ESA; or 9 10 (B) Received an ESA in the school year 11 immediately preceding the school year in which the sibling 12 applies for an ESA. 13 14 (f) For students eligible for receiving an ESA, under W.S. 21-2-904(a)(i), the following shall apply: 15 16 17 21-2-906. Duties of the state superintendent. 18 19 The state superintendent of public instruction (a) 20 shall: 21 22 (i) Establish a certification process for education service providers, which shall, at minimum, 23

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1 students attending qualified ensure ESA schools in 2 kindergarten through grade twelve (12) receive instruction 3 in reading, writing, mathematics, civics, including studies of the United States constitution and the constitution of 4 5 for pre-kindergarten ensure ESA students at minimum receive 6 instruction necessary for preparation to enter 7 8 kindergarten;

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10 (iv) For students eligible for an ESA under W.S. 11 21-2-904(a)(i), Ensure that parents of ESA students with 12 disabilities receive notice that participation in the ESA 13 program is a parental placement under 20 U.S.C. § 1412, Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), along 14 15 with an explanation of the rights that parentally placed 16 students possess under IDEA and any applicable state laws 17 and regulations;

19 (ix) Investigate reports of intentional and 20 substantial misuse of ESA funds and prohibit an eligible 21 ESA student from receipt of ESA funds if the state 22 superintendent determines that the ESA student or ESA 23 student's parent intentionally and substantially misused

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1	ESA funds. The state superintendent shall by rule create
2	procedures to ensure that a fair process exists to
3	determine whether an intentional and substantial misuse of
4	ESA funds has occurred. If an ESA student is free from
5	personal misconduct, that student shall be eligible for an
6	ESA in the future if placed with a different parent or
7	other person with the legal authority to act on behalf of
8	the student. The state superintendent shall have the
9	authority to refer suspected cases of intentional and
10	substantial misuse of ESA funds to the department of audit
11	or to law enforcement and the attorney general for
12	investigation and prosecution if evidence of fraudulent use
13	of ESA funds is obtained. A parent or ESA student may
14	appeal a final decision of the state superintendent to make
15	the parent or ESA student ineligible for the ESA program as
16	provided by the Wyoming Administrative Procedures Act;
17	
18	(xi) Notify parents and ESA students within ten

19 (10) business days if the state superintendent prohibits By
20 rule create procedures to ensure that a fair process exists
21 to determine whether an education service provider should
22 be prohibited from receiving ESA funds under paragraph (x)
23 of this subsection. Education service providers may appeal

<u>a final decision of the state superintendent under this</u>
 <u>paragraph as provided by the Wyoming Administrative</u>
 Procedures Act;

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5 (xii) For students eligible for an ESA under W.S. 21-2-904(a)(i), Ensure ESA students, who choose to, 6 7 participate in the statewide assessments administered 8 pursuant to W.S. 21-2-304(a) and compile the assessment results to analyze student proficiency and academic 9 10 progress among the students participating in the ESA 11 program, including an analysis of graduation rates, 12 proficiency and progress based on grade level. The results of the analysis under this paragraph shall be included in 13 the annual report required pursuant to W.S. 21-2-204(k);-14 15

16 <u>(xiii) If the state superintendent determines it</u> 17 is necessary, withhold from the funds to be deposited in 18 ESAs, a maximum of five percent (5%) annually of the funds 19 to be deposited in ESAs in the first two (2) school years 20 of the ESA program and a maximum of three percent (3%) 21 annually of the funds to be deposited in ESAs thereafter to 22 pay for the costs of administering the ESA program.

1	(d) Rules adopted by the state superintendent under
2	subsection (c) of this section shall focus on simplifying
3	parental access to the program and encouraging educational
4	service providers to provide parents and ESA students with
5	a broad array of educational options.
6	
7	(e) The state superintendent may accept gifts and
8	grants from any source to cover administrative costs of the
9	program, to inform the public about the ESA program or to
10	fund ESAs.
11	
12	21-2-909. Legal proceedings.
13	
14	(a) No liability shall arise on the part of the state
15	superintendent of public instruction or the state or any
16	public school or school district based on the award of or
17	use of an ESA pursuant to this act.
18	
19	(b) In any legal proceeding challenging the
20	application of this act or rule adopted under this act to
21	an education service provider, the state bears the burden
22	of proof to establish that the law is necessary and does

1	not impose any undue burden on the education service
2	provider.
3	
4	(c) If any part of this act is challenged in a state
5	court as violating either the state or federal
6	constitutions, parents of eligible students and parents of
7	ESA students shall be permitted to intervene in any lawsuit
8	for the purposes of defending the ESA program's
9	constitutionality. However, for the purposes of judicial
10	administration, a court may require that all parents file a
11	joint brief as long as the parents are not required to join
12	any brief filed on behalf of any named state defendant.
13	
14	(d) If any provision of this act or its application
15	to an individual or circumstance is held invalid, the
16	invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications
17	of this act which can be given effect without the invalid
18	provision or application, and to this end the provisions of
19	this act are severable.
20	
21	Section 3. W.S. 21-2-902(a)(vi) and 21-2-904(a)(i),
22	(ii) and (b)(ii)(B) are repealed.
23	

Section 4. 2024 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 108,
 Section 3 and Section 6(c) is repealed.

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4 Section 5. There is appropriated thirty million
5 dollars (\$30,000,000.00) from the general fund to the
6 Wyoming freedom scholarship program account created by
7 section 2 of this act for the purposes of the Wyoming
8 Freedom Scholarship Act.

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10 Section 6. This act is effective immediately upon 11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 13 Constitution.
