7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-25-301 is created to read:

- 11 ARTICLE 3
- 12 PARTICIPATION IN INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS

- 14 21-25-301. Intercollegiate athletic competitions
- 15 based on biological sex.

1 2 (a) As used in this section: 3 4 (i) "Athletic competition" means any 5 intercollegiate athletic display between teams or persons, including a contest, exhibition, performance or sport; 6 7 8 (ii) "Educational institution" the means 9 University of Wyoming and each Wyoming community college. 10 11 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this 12 section, no educational institution shall allow: 13 14 (i) A student compete in athletic to an 15 competition sponsored or authorized by the educational 16 institution that is designated for the sex opposite to the 17 student's sex; 18 19 (ii) A male student to compete in an athletic 20 competition that is mixed-sex in a position that 21 designated by rule or procedure for female students.

1	(c) An educational institution may allow a female							
2	student to compete in an athletic competition that is							
3	designated for male students if a corresponding athletic							
4	competition designated for female students is not offered							
5	or available.

7	(d) For purposes of this section:							
8								
9	(i) A student's sex is the sex correctly stated							
10	on the student's official birth certificate as described in							
11	paragraph (ii) of this subsection or, if the student's							
12	official birth certificate is unobtainable, another							
13	government record that accurately states the student's sex							
14	at birth;							
15								
16	(ii) A statement of a student's sex on the							
17	student's official birth certificate is considered to have							
18	correctly stated the student's sex only if the statement							
19	was entered at or near the time of the student's birth or							
20	modified to correct a clerical error in the student's sex.							
21								
22	(e) No educational institution shall retaliate							

against a person for reporting a violation of this section.

1	An	educational	institution	may	discipline	а	student	or

- 3 violation of this section.

- 5 (f) A person shall have a private civil cause of
- 6 action against an educational institution for any violation
- 7 of this section. An action filed pursuant to this section
- 8 shall be subject to W.S. 1-39-113 and 1-39-114. The
- 9 liability of an educational institution for any violation
- 10 of this section shall not exceed fifty thousand dollars
- 11 (\$50,000.00).

- 13 (g) The University of Wyoming and the Wyoming
- 14 community college commission shall promulgate rules to
- 15 implement this section. Rules adopted under this subsection
- 16 shall ensure compliance with state and federal law
- 17 regarding the confidentiality of student medical
- 18 information.

20 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2025.
