A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to school districts; requiring public
- 2 school children to use restrooms that align with their sex
- 3 at birth; requiring reasonable accommodations; providing
- 4 exceptions; providing penalties; providing definitions; and
- 5 providing for an effective date.

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 **Section 1**. W.S. 21-3-137 is created to read:

10

11 21-3-137. Restrooms in public schools; requirements;

12 definitions; penalties; rulemaking.

1 (a) As used in this section:

2

3 (i) "Coach" means a person, including but not

4 limited to coaches, assistant coaches or athletic trainers,

employed by or contracted with a public school who is 5

involved in the teaching, coaching or training of students 6

7 participating in a school-sponsored athletic activity;

9 (ii) "Multiple occupancy restroom or changing

10 room" means a room in a public school building designed or

11 designated to be used by more than one (1) person at the

12 same time, where persons may be in various stages of

undress in the presence of other persons. The term includes 13

but is not limited to a school restroom, locker room, 14

15 changing room or shower room;

16

17 (iii) "School-sponsored athletic activity" means

a sporting event that is supported and affiliated with the 18

19 school;

21 (iv) "Sex" defined W.S. means as by

22 21-25-101(a)(iv).

1	(b) To ensure privacy and safety, each public school
2	district that serves students in pre-kindergarten through
3	twelfth grade in this state shall require every multiple
4	occupancy restroom or changing room to be designated as
5	follows:
6	
7	(i) For the exclusive use of the male sex; or
8	
9	(ii) For the exclusive use of the female sex.
10	
11	(c) Each public school district shall provide a
12	reasonable accommodation to any person who does not wish to
13	use a multiple occupancy restroom or changing room in
14	accordance with the designation required under subsection
15	(b) of this section. For purposes of this subsection, a
16	reasonable accommodation shall include a single-occupancy
17	restroom or changing room.
18	
19	(d) This section shall not apply to persons entering
20	a multiple occupancy restroom or changing room designated
21	for use by the opposite sex when entering for at least one

(1) of the following reasons:

Τ	(1) For custodial, maintenance, repair or
2	inspection purposes;

4	(ii) To render emergency medical assistance;
5	
6	(iii) If a suitable meeting room or area is not
7	available, a coach may enter a locker room before, during
8	or after a school-sponsored athletic activity, provided:

10	(A) All students present are fully clothed;
11	
12	(B) The coach may be accompanied by not
13	less than one (1) additional adult at all times;
14	
15	(C) If the coach is the opposite sex of the
16	students present, the coach shall be accompanied by at
17	least one (1) adult of the same sex as the students
18	present; and

20	(D) The adults present shall not be current
21	high school students.

1 (iv) For an adult to render assistance to any

2 student or person requiring assistance because of

5 (v) If a suitable meeting room or area is not available and the coach is the coach of a school-sponsored 6

sexes on the team or in the activity, the coach may enter a 8

athletic activity with members of both the male and female

9 locker room before, during or after the school-sponsored

available, the coach shall be accompanied by not less than 11

one (1) additional adult at all times but an additional 12

17 (e) Each school district board of trustees shall adopt policies to provide for disciplinary action for 18 19 persons who refuse to comply with this section.

1	(g) A parent or legal guardian of a student enrolled
2	in and physically attending a public school district shall
3	have a cause of action against the public school for
4	noncompliance with the provisions of subsection (b), (c) or
5	(d) of this section.

7	Section 2. W.S. 21-3-110(a) by creating a new
8	paragraph (xliv) is amended to read:
9	
10	21-3-110. Duties of boards of trustees.
11	
12	(a) The board of trustees in each school district
13	shall:
14	
15	(xliv) Ensure that each school district in the
16	state requires every multiple occupancy restroom or
17	changing room be designated for the exclusive use of the
18	male sex or the exclusive use of the female sex.
19	

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
