## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to county coroners; amending the
- 2 disposition of property for decedents without personal
- 3 representatives or next of kin; specifying the disposition
- 4 of proceeds; making conforming amendments; and providing
- 5 for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-4-207(b) and by creating a new
- 10 subsection (c) is amended to read:

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12 7-4-207. Disposition of body and effects of deceased.

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- 14 (b) The coroner shall, within a reasonable time after
- 15 completing the investigation, turn over to the appointed

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1 personal representative of the estate of the deceased or,

2 if none, to the clerk of the district court of the county,

3 the coroner shall dispose of all money or other property

4 found upon the body of the deceased in accordance with

5 subsection (c) of this section. Personal items valued at

6 less than fifty dollars (\$50.00) and items necessary for

7 the convenience of the deceased's next of kin may be

8 released to the deceased's next of kin.

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10 (c) If there is no personal representative of the estate and if the deceased's next of kin does not claim the 11 12 money and property found upon the body of the deceased 13 within one hundred eighty (180) days, the coroner shall cause the property to be sold at public auction to the 14 15 highest bidder or by any other means of sale adopted by the 16 county in which the investigation occurs. All money and any 17 proceeds from the sale or auction of the property shall 18 first be used to pay the expenses of the burial in 19 accordance with subsection (a) of this section. Any 20 remaining money and proceeds in excess of fifty dollars 21 (\$50.00) shall be deposited and placed in the custody of the state treasurer under the Uniform Unclaimed Property 22 23 Act.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2025.
