A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to state lands; amending the duties of the 2 state forester; creating the wildfire management task 3 force; specifying members, duties and duration of the task 4 force; requiring reports; providing appropriations; 5 providing for the transfer of funds; authorizing borrowing; 6 repealing prior borrowing authorizations; and providing for 7 an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 36-2-108(a), (b)(viii) and by creating new paragraphs (ix) through (xi) is amended to read:

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136-2-108. Appointmentofstateforester;2qualifications; duties.

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4 (a) The state board of land commissioners shall appoint a state forester who shall be the administrative 5 head of the Wyoming state forestry division of the office 6 of state lands and investments. He shall serve at the 7 8 pleasure of the board. He shall have a bachelor's degree in forestry with not less than four (4) years experience in 9 professional forestry work. The state forester shall, under 10 the general supervision of the board, have direction of all 11 forest interest and all matters pertaining to forestry 12 within the jurisdiction of the state of Wyoming.; and may, 13 with approval of the board, appoint such assistants and 14 15 employees as are necessary in executing the duties of his 16 office.

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18 (b) The state forester shall:

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20 (viii) Cooperate with federal agencies <u>and all</u>
21 <u>political subdivision of the state</u> to fulfill the intent of
22 this section:-

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1	(ix) Adopt rules as necessary to fulfill the
2	duties described in this article;
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4	(x) Appoint assistants and employees as are
5	necessary in executing the duties of the division;
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7	(xi) Maintain wildland and forestry fire control
8	programs including, but not limited to:
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10	(A) Fire management, coordination and
11	reimbursement for all lands owned and managed by the state
12	of Wyoming and its agencies;
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14	(B) Fire management assistance within the
15	state of Wyoming;
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17	(C) Pre-position suppression equipment,
18	personnel and other resources during periods of high
19	wildfire risk;
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21	(D) Support for local fire jurisdiction
22	training programs;
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1	(E) Establishing standards and regulations
2	for privately contracted private wildland fire resources
3	operating in Wyoming. As used in this subparagraph,
4	"privately contracted private fire resources" includes
5	services retained by insurers for prevention and
6	suppression activities on insured properties.
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8	Section 2.
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10	(a) There is created the wildfire management task
11	force to consist of the following members:
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13	(i) Members of the legislature as follows:
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15	(A) Two (2) members of the Wyoming house of
16	representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house. The
17	speaker of the house shall designate one (1) of the members
18	appointed under this subparagraph to be co-chairman of the
19	task force;
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21	(B) Two (2) members of the Wyoming senate,
22	appointed by the president of the senate. The president of
23	the senate shall designate one (1) of the members appointed

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1 under this subparagraph to be co-chairman of the task force. 2 3 4 (ii) Members and officials of the Wyoming state government as follows: 5 6 7 (A) The governor or the governor's 8 designee; 9 10 (B) The president of the Wyoming fire advisory board or the president's designee; 11 12 13 (C) The Wyoming state forester or the 14 forester's designee; 15 16 (D) The state insurance commissioner or the 17 commissioner's designee. 18 19 (iii) Other members appointed by the governor as 20 follows: 21 22 (A) One (1) member representing Wyoming local governments; 23

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1 2 (B) One (1) member representing the agriculture industry; 3 4 5 (C) One (1) member of the forest product industry. 6 7 8 (b) The task force shall: 9 10 (i) Study the wildfire impacts to private and state lands, state agencies, local fire jurisdictions, 11 12 individuals and communities; 13 14 (ii) Identify and evaluate wildland fire response systems, including but not limited to, funding, 15 16 suppression, training, coordination, prevention, 17 mobilization, cooperative agreements and other related 18 programs; 19 20 (iii) Not later than November 15, 2025, report to the governor, the joint agriculture, state and public 21 22 lands and water resources interim committee and the joint appropriations committee on the work of the task force 23

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including any recommendations for legislation for
 consideration by an appropriate legislative committee.

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4 (c) The task force shall be staffed by the5 legislative service office.

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7 (d) The legislative members of the task force shall 8 receive salary, per diem and travel expenses in the manner and amount prescribed by W.S. 28-5-101. Task force members 9 10 representing Wyoming state government shall be considered 11 to be acting within the scope of regular employment when conducting the official business of the task force and 12 13 shall receive their regular pay without additional compensation, except that those members 14 shall receive mileage and per diem as provided for other members of the 15 task force under this subsection if the members are not 16 17 reimbursed by their employer. All other members of the task force shall not receive salary but shall receive per diem 18 19 and mileage in the amount provided for members of the 20 legislature under W.S. 28-5-101 when conducting the official business of the task force. 21

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(e) The task force shall terminate on December 31,
 2026.

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4 (f) There is appropriated twenty-five thousand 5 dollars (\$25,000.00) from the general fund to the legislative service office for purposes of providing 6 salary, mileage and per diem to the legislative members of 7 8 the task force appointed under this section and for other 9 expenses of the task force. This appropriation shall be for 10 the period beginning with the effective date of this act 11 and ending June 30, 2027. This appropriation shall not be 12 transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining 13 from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 14 15 2027.

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17 (g) There is appropriated twenty-five thousand 18 dollars (\$25,000.00) from the general fund to the office of 19 the governor for purposes of providing mileage and per diem 20 to the nonlegislative members of the task force. This 21 appropriation shall be for the period beginning with the 22 effective date of this act and ending June 30, 2027. This 23 appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any

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1 and any unexpended, unobligated other purpose funds 2 remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided 3 by law on June 30, 2027. 4 Section 3. 5 б 7 (a) There is appropriated from the general fund for 8 the purpose of restoring funds expended by the state of Wyoming to suppress wildfires that occurred in calendar 9 10 year 2024 the following amounts for the following programs 11 or purposes: 12 13 (i) One million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for the special contingency division of the office of the governor, 14 unit 0601; 15 16 17 (ii) One million two hundred sixty-three thousand nine hundred sixty-six dollars (\$1,263,966.00) for 18 19 the disaster contingency unit within the homeland security 20 division of the office of the governor, unit 1106; 21

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(iii) Twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000.00) to
 the emergency fire suppression account within the office of
 state lands and investments.

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5 (b) There is appropriated from the general fund up to twenty million dollars (\$20,000,000.00), or as much thereof 6 as is necessary, to be deposited by the state auditor in 7 8 the legislative stabilization reserve account for repayment of funds borrowed on or before June 30, 2025 from the 9 10 legislative stabilization reserve account under 2024 Wyoming session laws, chapter 118, section 301(b). 11

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(c) Funds appropriated in this section shall not be 13 14 transferred or expended for other any purpose. 15 Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008, 9-2-1012(e) and 9-4-207, 16 funds appropriated in this section shall not lapse at the 17 end of any fiscal period. Any unexpended, unobligated funds at the end of any fiscal period shall remain in the account 18 19 to which the funds were appropriated and be expended for 20 the purposes specified by this section, except as otherwise 21 provided by further legislative authorization.

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1 Section 4. For the period beginning July 1, 2025 and 2 ending June 30, 2026, the governor is authorized to borrow 3 from the legislative stabilization reserve account up to 4 forty million dollars (\$40,000,000.00) as necessary to meet funding requirements to fight wildfires in the event the 5 reserves in the office of state lands and investments' 6 forestry division have been exhausted. The governor shall 7 report to the joint appropriations committee, the president 8 senate of 9 of the and the speaker the house of exercise 10 representatives immediately upon this of 11 authority. 12 Section 5. 13 14 The appropriations in section 3(a) of this act 15 (a) 16 shall be reduced in accordance with the following:

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(i) The appropriation in section 3(a)(i) of this
act shall be reduced by one dollar (\$1.00) for every one
dollar (\$1.00) appropriated in 2025 Senate File 0001 or
2025 House Bill 0001 for the special contingency division
of the office of the governor, unit 0601, for the purposes
specified in section 3(a) of this act;

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2	(ii) The appropriation in section 3(a)(ii) of
3	this act shall be reduced by one dollar (\$1.00) for every
4	one dollar (\$1.00) appropriated in 2025 Senate File 0001 or
5	2025 House Bill 0001 for the disaster contingency unit
6	within the homeland security division of the office of the
7	governor, unit 1106, for the purposes specified in section
8	3(a) of this act;
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10	(iii) The appropriation in section 3(a)(iii) of
11	this act shall be reduced by one dollar (\$1.00) for every
12	one dollar (\$1.00) appropriated in 2025 Senate File 0001 or
13	2025 House Bill 0001 to the emergency fire suppression
14	account within the office of state lands and investments
15	for the purposes specified in section 3(a) of this act.
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17	(b) The appropriation in section 3(b) of this act
18	shall be reduced by one dollar (\$1.00) for every one dollar
19	(\$1.00) appropriated in 2025 Senate File 0001 or 2025 House
20	Bill 0001 to the legislative stabilization reserve account
21	for the repayment of funds borrowed on or before June 30,
22	2025 from the account under 2024 Wyoming session laws,
23	chapter 118, section 301(b).

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2 (c) The borrowing authorization provided in section 4 of this act shall be reduced by one dollar (\$1.00) for 3 4 every one dollar (\$1.00) of borrowing authorization provided in section 301(b) of 2025 Senate File 0001 or 5 6 section 301(b) of 2025 House Bill 0001. 7 8 Section 6. 2024 Wyoming session laws, chapter 118, 9 section 301(b) is repealed. 10 Section 7. This act is effective immediately upon 11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 12 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 14 Constitution. 15 16 (END)

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
