Source of revenue increase:

The bill increases annual snowmobile registration fees. Specifically, it creates a \$25.00 registration fee for antique snowmobiles; increases resident snowmobile fees by \$15.00; increases non-resident snowmobile fees by \$35.00; and increases commercial snowmobile fees by \$45.00. Table 1 shows the estimate by category.
