AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; providing for a new 1 2 criminal offense of cruelty to animals; increasing the maximum fine for a misdemeanor first offense cruelty to 3 animals conviction; providing for the suspension of hunting 4 5 privileges for a cruelty to animals conviction as 6 specified; authorizing game and fish law enforcement to 7 enforce the criminal provisions of cruelty to animals as specified; specifying applicability; and providing for an 8 9 effective date.
