1 AN ACT relating to the prioritization of cease and transfer 2 projects for municipal solid waste facilities; authorizing expenditure of previously appropriated funds; establishing 3 a prioritized list of projects; establishing a maximum 4 5 amount to be expended on projects; granting the department б of environmental quality limited discretionary authority to 7 modify the prioritized list; specifying expenditures for a 8 carcass management project; providing definitions; requiring reports; repealing a prior priority list of cease 9 10 and transfer projects; and providing for an effective date. 11

1 (iii) Based on compliance with grant or loan 2 qualifications or conditions; 3 4 (iv) To address emergency or immediate 5 environmental concerns. 6 7 (e) Not later than October 15 of each year, the 8 department of environmental quality shall report: 9 (i) Any modification of the prioritized list 10 contained in subsection (b) of this section to the joint 11 12 minerals, business and economic development interim committee and the joint appropriations committee; 13 14 names of recipients and 15 (ii) The amounts 16 expended for the carcass management project established by 17 priority 1 in subsections (b) and (c) of this section to the joint minerals, business and economic development 18 19 interim committee. 20 Section 2. 2024 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 32 is 21 repealed. 22

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
