A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to elections; amending procedures for 2 filling vacancies in specified federal and state offices; 3 requiring special elections as specified; making conforming 4 amendments; repealing obsolete provisions; and providing 5 for an effective date. 6

7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8

9 Section 1. W.S. 9-1-212, 9-1-802(e),
10 22-2-101(a)(iii), 22-2-110(a), 22-2-111(a), 22-18-103,
11 22-18-105 through 22-18-109, 22-18-111(a)(intro) and
12 (iii)(intro) and 28-1-106 are amended to read:
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9-1-212. Vacancy in office of governor; term of
 successor; when election held to fill unexpired term;
 requirements of elections; term of person elected.

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Whenever the powers and duties of the office of the 5 governor of the state of Wyoming devolve upon any other 6 person as provided in W.S. 9-1-211(a), the person acting as 7 8 governor shall continue to act as governor until the end of the term of the governor if the office is assumed less than 9 10 sixty (60) days before the next general election. If the 11 office is assumed more than sixty (60) days before a 12 general election the person acting as governor shall issue an additional proclamation calling for the election of a 13 governor to fill the unexpired term, which election shall 14 15 take place at the same time as the general election, and 16 the election, together with the returns and canvass 17 thereof, shall be conducted in all respects as though it was an original election for governor. When the state 18 19 canvassing board canvasses the vote of the election and 20 declares a person at the election to be elected as 21 governor, the person call for a special election as 22 provided in W.S. 22-18-103 through 22-18-109. The candidate 23 issued a certificate of election under W.S. 22-18-109

shall, within thirty (30) days after the canvass issuance 1 2 of the certificate, or as soon thereafter as possible, 3 qualify and assume the duties and powers of governor, and 4 shall be the governor of the state of Wyoming for the 5 remainder of the unexpired term of the governor. б 7 9-1-802. Election; term; qualifications; full-time; private practice prohibited; exception; salary; vacancies. 8 9 10 (e) A vacancy in the office of district attorney shall be filled by the board or boards of county 11 12 commissioners under the procedure for filling vacancies in the office of a member of the state legislature or state 13 senator established by W.S. $\frac{22-18-111}{22-18-111}$ (iii) (A) 14 through (D). Vacancies shall be filled until the next 15 16 general election and the appointee shall be qualified 17 pursuant to subsections (b) and (c) of this section. 18 19 22-2-101. (a) Chapters 1 through 28 of this Election Code applyto the following elections:

8	22-2-110. Computing periods of time.
9	
10	(a) Except for special elections to fill vacancies
11	for a congressman under W.S. 22-18-105 22-18-103 through
12	22-18-109, periods of time are computed by excluding the
13	specific day and counting the prescribed number of days,
14	including Saturdays, Sundays and full legal holidays. If
15	the first day of a time period falls on a Saturday, Sunday
16	or full legal holiday, the preceding day which is not a
17	Saturday, Sunday or full legal holiday shall be used. If
18	the last day of a time period falls on a Saturday, Sunday
19	or full legal holiday, the next day which is not a
20	Saturday, Sunday or full legal holiday shall be used. All
21	days, except the specific day, but including the last day,
22	shall be used to compute the time limits established under
23	W.S. <u>22-18-105</u> <u>22-18-103</u> through 22-18-109 unless the last

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day of a time period falls on a Saturday, Sunday or full 1 2 legal holiday in which case the next day which is not a 3 Saturday, Sunday or full legal holiday shall be used. 4 5 22-2-111. Employees time off to vote. б (a) Any person entitled to vote at any primary or 7 8 general election or special election to fill a vacancy in 9 the office of representatives in the congress of the United 10 States under W.S. 22-18-103 through 22-18-109 is, on the day of such election, entitled to absent himself from any 11 12 service or employment in which he is then engaged or employed for a period of one (1) hour, other than meal 13 hours, the hour being at the convenience of the employer, 14 15 between the time of opening and closing of the polls. Such 16 elector shall not, because of so absenting himself, lose 17 any pay, providing he actually casts his legal vote. 18 19 22-18-103. Filling vacancies in federal and state 20 offices; generally. 21 22 A vacancy in the office of United States senator, 23 representative in congress, member of the state legislature

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1	or an elected state official shall be filled for the
2	unexpired term at a special election called for the purpose
3	by the governor, provided the vacancy does not occur within
4	six (6) months of the next general election as provided in
5	W.S. 22-18-103 through 22-18-109. For purposes of W.S.
6	22-18-103 through 22-18-109, "vacated office" means an
7	office specified in this section.
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9	22-18-105. Filling vacancy of congressman; whether
10	filled at general or special election; procedure.
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12	(a) If the Except for temporary appointments in W.S.
13	22-18-111 and except for vacancies in the office of a
14	member of the state legislature within the time specified
15	in W.S. 22-18-111(a)(iii), a vacancy in the office of
16	representative in congress that occurs within six (6)
17	months prior to the next general election, the vacancy the
18	following time period shall be filled at the general
19	election:. Otherwise
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21	(i) Six (6) months of the next general election
22	for the office of United States senator or representative
23	in congress;

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2	(ii) Three (3) months of the next general
3	election for the office of a member of the state
4	legislature, secretary of state, state auditor, state

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7	(iii) Sixty (60) days of the next general
8	election for the office of governor.
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10	(b) A vacancy that occurs outside the time period
11	specified in subsection (a) of this section shall be filled
12	for the unexpired term at a special election. Unless the
13	Tuesday falls on a full legal holiday, the special election
14	shall occur on the <u>first</u> Tuesday <u>next</u> following the <u>:</u>
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16	(i) Eighty-ninth day after the vacancy occurs,
17	unless that for the office of United States senator or
18	representative in congress;

Filling vacancies in federal and state offices; nominations. 18 19 20 An elector qualified to hold the a vacated office of representative in congress shall may be nominated by the 21 state central committee of the respective parties to fill a 22 23 vacancy for the unexpired term of that office filing a

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signed petition in substantially the form specified in W.S. 1 2 22-5-301(a). Nominations from such parties shall be filed 3 with the secretary of state and fees paid within seven (7) 4 days after the vacancy is officially declared. Independent 5 candidates shall file an application and pay the filing fee 6 with the secretary of state within seven (7) days after the 7 vacancy is officially declared. 8 9 22-18-107. Filling vacancies in federal and state 10 offices; certification of candidates. 11 12 Within five (5) days after the end of the candidate filing period specified in W.S. 22-18-106, the secretary of state 13 shall certify to the clerks of counties voting to fill the 14 15 vacancy the name of each candidate qualified to appear on 16 the ballot, and his the candidate's party affiliation or 17 independent status, if declared. 18 19 22-18-108. Filling vacancies in federal and state 20 offices; party requirements. 21 22 A candidate for the unexpired term of the a vacated office 23 of representative in congress may seek election only as a

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candidate of the political party in which he the candidate

2 was registered on the date the vacancy occurred. A 3 candidate for the unexpired term of a vacated office of 4 representative in congress who was not registered with a party on the date the vacancy occurred may run only as an 5 independent. б 7 8 22-18-109. Conduct of special election; preparation of ballot. 9 10 11 A special election to fill a vacancy shall be conducted by 12 the county clerk as nearly as possible in the manner of a general election. The county clerk shall have twelve (12) 13 14 days to prepare the special election ballot after the secretary of state's certification under W.S. 22-18-107. 15 16 The candidate who receives a plurality of the votes at a 17 special election shall be issued a certificate of election 18 as provided by law. 19

20 22-18-111. Vacancies in other offices; temporary 21 appointments.

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1 (a) Any vacancy in any other elective office in the 2 state except representative in congress or the offices 3 specified in W.S. 22-18-103 or the board of trustees of a 4 school or community college district, shall be filled by the governing body, or as otherwise provided in this 5 section, by appointment of a temporary successor. 6 The person appointed shall serve until a successor for the 7 8 remainder of the unexpired term is elected at the next general election and takes office on the first Monday of 9 the following January. **Provided** Except as provided in W.S. 10 11 22-18-105, if a vacancy in a four (4) year term of office 12 occurs in the term's second or subsequent years after the 13 first day for filing an application for nomination pursuant to W.S. 22-5-209, no election to fill the vacancy shall be 14 15 held and the temporary successor appointed shall serve the 16 remainder of the unexpired term. The following apply: 17 18 (iii) Notwithstanding W.S. 22-18-103 through 19 22-18-109, if a vacancy occurs in the office of a member of

20 the state legislature not more than forty-five (45) days
21 before the first day of the general or budget session of
22 the legislature:

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1 28-1-106. Resignation of office. 2 3 (a) Resignation of the office of a member of the 4 senate or house of representatives shall be made to the governor, who shall immediately notify the following of the 5 resignation: 6 7 8 (i) The secretary of state, who shall notify the county clerks of the counties in which the legislative 9 10 district is located; 11 12 (ii) The presiding officer of the house of which 13 the person is a member; 14 15 (iii) If the resignation occurs in the time 16 periods specified in W.S. 22-18-111(a)(iii), the state 17 central committee of the party which the member represented at the time of his election under W.S. 22-6-120(a)(vii), or 18 19 at the time of his appointment if not elected to office. τ 20 of the resignation. If the resigning member did not represent a political party at the time of his election, or 21 at the time of his appointment if not elected to office, 22 the governor shall notify the appropriate boards of county 23

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1 commissioners who shall proceed in accordance with W.S. 2 22-18-111(a)(iii)(C). 3 4 (b) For purposes of this section, a person shall be considered to "represent" a political party if he the 5 person was a nominee of that political party when elected 6 7 to office or when appointed to fill a vacancy in office. 8 9 Section 2. W.S. 22-18-104 and 22-18-111(a)(i) are 10 repealed. 11 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 12 13 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution. 15 16 17 (END)
