A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to public health and safety; requiring

2 rules enacted during public health emergencies to provide

3 exemptions for religious assembly as specified; providing

4 for enforcement and remedies; authorizing a cause of

5 action; providing exceptions to the Wyoming Governmental

6 Claims Act; making conforming amendments; and providing for

7 an effective date.

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 **Section 1**. W.S. 35-4-116 is created to read:

13 35-4-116. Public health emergencies; religious

14 assembly exemptions.

- 1 (a) For any order, rule, regulation, policy or
- 2 directive issued during a public health emergency as
- 3 defined by W.S. 35-4-115(a)(i) that requires the closure of
- 4 or otherwise limits a business or other entity from
- 5 remaining open and that exempts, in whole or in part, any
- 6 business or entity from those closure requirements or
- 7 limitations, the order, rule, regulation, policy or
- 8 directive shall provide the same exemption to:

9

- 10 (i) Any place of worship qualifying as an exempt
- 11 organization for religious purposes under section 501(c)(3)
- 12 of the federal Internal Revenue Code;

13

- 14 (ii) Churches, their integrated auxiliaries and
- 15 conventions or associations of churches;

16

- 17 (iii) Any gathering for religious assembly in
- 18 any place otherwise open for religious assembly, including
- 19 those taking place in private residences and public places.

20

- 21 (b) This section shall be construed to afford to
- 22 religious institutions, places of worship and religious
- 23 assemblies the same degree of freedom to meet during public

- 1 health emergencies as is afforded to any business or entity
- 2 that is exempted from closure requirements implemented
- 3 during a public health emergency.

4

- 5 (c) Any person aggrieved by a violation of this
- 6 section may bring a civil action for relief in any court of
- 7 competent jurisdiction. A court may, for an act or practice
- 8 that violates this section:

9

10 (i) Award damages, costs and attorney fees;

11

- 12 (ii) Issue a declaratory judgment for or enjoin
- 13 an act or practice that violates this section;

14

- 15 (iii) Award exemplary or punitive damages, if
- 16 the act or practice that violates this section was wanton
- 17 or malicious.

- 19 **Section 2.** W.S. 1-39-104(a), 1-39-118(d) and
- $20 \quad 1-42-202(f)$ are amended to read:

21

22 1-39-104. Granting immunity from tort liability;

3

23 liability on contracts; exceptions.

1

2 (a) A governmental entity and its public employees 3 while acting within the scope of duties are granted 4 immunity from liability for any tort except as provided by 5 W.S. 1-39-105 through 1-39-112, 1-39-122, and 1-39-123 and 35-4-116. Any immunity in actions based on a contract 6 7 entered into by a governmental entity is waived except to 8 the extent provided by the contract if the contract was 9 within the powers granted to the entity and was properly 10 executed and except as provided in W.S. 1-39-120(b). The 11 claims procedures of W.S. 1-39-113 apply to contractual 12 claims against governmental entities.

13

14 1-39-118. Maximum liability; insurance authorized.

15

16 (d) Except as provided by W.S. 35-4-116, no judgment
17 against a governmental entity shall include an award for
18 exemplary or punitive damages, for interest prior to
19 judgments or for attorney's fees.

20

21 1-42-202. Local government self-insurance program; 22 creation; authorized payments.

23

1 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act

2 and except as provided by W.S. 35-4-116, no expenditure

3 shall be made from the program in any action to pay any

4 claim or final judgment for exemplary or punitive damages.

5

6 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon

7 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

8 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

9 Constitution.
