## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to administration of the government; prohibiting the implementation of immigration sanctuary 2 policies by cities, towns, counties and the state; 3 4 prohibiting the designation of sanctuary cities, towns, 5 counties and the state; creating a new felony offense; 6 providing penalties; providing definitions; making conforming amendments; and providing for an effective date. 7 8

5	(a) As used in this chapter:

7	(i) "Executive order" means a directive, order,
8	policy or proclamation that manages the operation of the
9	state government issued by the governor;

L2	enforcement officers" means any person employed by the

status or the identity or location of a person who is 5

reasonably believed to be illegally residing within the 6

United States or involved in international terrorism or 7

10 "Local official or employee" means (v)

elected or appointed official, supervisor or managerial 11

12 employee, contractor, agent or peace officer acting on

13 behalf of or in conjunction with a city, town or county;

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15 (vi) "Policy" means any regulation,

16 ordinance, policy or practice adopted by the governing body

17 of a city, town or county;

20 "sanctuary state" means a jurisdiction that limits

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2 9-25-102. Prohibition on immigration sanctuary

3 policies and designations; penalty.

5 (a) No governing body of a city, town or county,

6 whether acting through its governing body or by an

7 initiative, referendum or other process, shall:

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9 (i) Enact, adopt, implement or enforce any

10 policy that prohibits or restricts local officials or

11 employees from communicating or cooperating with federal

12 officials or law enforcement officers with regard to

13 reporting immigration status information while the local

14 official or employee is acting within the scope of the

15 official's or employee's official duties;

16

17 (ii) Declare or designate the city, town or

18 county as a sanctuary city, town or county.

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20 (b) Upon a determination by the governor, with a

21 recommendation from the attorney general, that a governing

22 body of a city, town or county has violated subsection (a)

23 of this section, the governor shall require the office of

state lands and investments and the department of revenue 1 2 to withhold all state and state administered federal 3 funding directly paid to the city, town or county, unless 4 otherwise specifically provided by law, until the city, town or county complies with subsection (a) of 5 this 6 section. After a city, town or county complies with subsection (a) of this section, the office of state lands 7 8 and investments and the department of revenue shall resume distribution of state and state administered federal 9 10 funding directly paid to the city, town or county but the 11 office of state lands and investments and the department of 12 revenue shall not distribute funds that were withheld 13 during the period of noncompliance with this section to the city, town or county that violated subsection (a) of this 14 section. The department of revenue shall distribute funds 15 16 that were withheld on a pro rata basis to the other receiving cities, towns or counties who are in compliance 17 with this section. 18

20 (c) No state employee shall be prohibited or 21 restricted from communicating or cooperating with federal 22 officials or law enforcement officers with regard to 23 reporting immigration status information while the state

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- 1 employee is acting within the scope of the employee's
- 2 official duties.

- 4 (d) No executive order shall declare or designate the
- 5 state of Wyoming as a sanctuary state.

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- 7 (e) Any local official or employee who refuses to
- 8 communicate or cooperate with federal officials or law
- 9 enforcement officers with regard to reporting immigration
- 10 status information while the local official or employee is
- 11 acting within the scope of the official's or employee's
- 12 official duties shall be quilty of a felony punishable by
- 13 imprisonment for not less than five (5) years and not more
- 14 than ten (10) years, a fine of not more than twenty
- 15 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00), or both.

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- 17 **Section 2.** W.S. 22-24-301 and 22-24-401 are amended
- 18 to read:

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20 **22-24-301.** Right of initiative; limitations.

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- 22 The people may propose and enact laws by the initiative.
- 23 However, the initiative shall not be used to dedicate

- 1 revenues, make or repeal appropriations, create courts,
- 2 define the jurisdiction of courts or prescribe their rules,
- 3 enact local or special legislation, enact anything
- 4 prohibited by the constitution for enactment by the
- 5 legislature, enact immigration sanctuary laws prohibited by
- 6 W.S. 9-25-102 or enact anything that is substantially the
- 7 same as that defeated by an initiative election within five
- 8 (5) years preceding the time of filing of the petition.

10 22-24-401. Right of referendum; limitations.

11

- 12 The people may approve or reject acts of the legislature by
- 13 the referendum. However, the referendum shall not be
- 14 applied to dedications of revenue, to appropriations, to
- 15 local or special legislation, to immigration sanctuary laws
- 16 prohibited by W.S. 9-25-102 or to laws necessary for the
- 17 immediate preservation of the public peace, health or
- 18 safety.

1 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
