## for

1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; requiring the game and 2 fish commission to issue bear coupons as specified; making 3 legislative findings; requiring the game and fish commission to provide evidence of grizzly bear population 4 5 recovery as specified; making conforming amendments; requiring rulemaking; and providing for effective dates. 6 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 Section 1. W.S. 23-1-703(c), 23-2-101(j)(intro) and 10 11 23-3-105(a) and by creating a new subsection (d) are 12 amended to read: 13

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23-1-703. Limitation of number of certain licenses;
 reservation of certain licenses; reservation of certain
 unused licenses.

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5 (c) Except as provided in W.S. 23-3-105(d) and except as provided in this subsection and subsection (f) of this 6 section or by rule of the commission, no person who is 7 8 issued a hunting license on and after July 1, 2022 for a grizzly bear, or for a mountain goat, any moose or antlered 9 10 moose, any ram bighorn sheep, any bighorn sheep and any 11 wild bison, and no person who, on July 1, 2022, is subject 12 to the five (5) year restriction under subsection (b) of 13 this section for a moose or bighorn sheep license, shall be eligible to apply for or receive a hunting license for that 14 15 particular species in any future year. The commission may 16 issue hunting licenses to any person in future years when 17 necessary for wildlife management purposes to harvest grizzly bear, mountain goat, ewe or lamb bighorn sheep or 18 19 cow or calf moose. The commission may issue hunting 20 licenses to any person to harvest cow or calf wild bison 21 pursuant to W.S. 23-2-107(f).

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1 23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 2 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency 3 required; donation of refunded application fees. 4 (j) Subject to W.S. 23-1-705(e), 23-2-101(f), 5 23-1-705(e) and 23-3-105(d) and the applicable fee under 6 W.S. 23-1-701, the following hunting licenses and tags may 7 8 be purchased for the fee indicated and subject to the limitations provided: 9 10 11 23-3-105. Antelope, deer and elk coupons; payment to 12 landowner; kill on federal or state land; bear coupons. 13 (a) Antelope, deer and elk licenses shall have two 14 15 (2) coupons attached, each bearing the same serial number 16 as the body of the permit, one (1) designated "antelope, 17 deer or elk coupon" and one (1) designated "landowner's coupon". Each resident elk license may have an additional 18 19 coupon attached as provided in subsection (d) of this 20 section. 21

22 (d) Each resident elk license issued for 2026 and
23 2027 in a hunt area that is entirely outside of the greater

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1	Yellowstone ecosystem recovery zone as established by the
2	United States fish and wildlife service shall include a
3	bear coupon. Nothing in this subsection shall prohibit the
4	issuance of a bear coupon for a hunt area that is in whole
5	or in part within any demographic monitoring area
6	established outside the greater Yellowstone ecosystem
7	recovery zone. The bear coupon shall not require an
8	additional license fee under W.S. 23-2-101(j) and shall not
9	be considered a license for purposes of W.S. 23-1-703(c). A
10	bear coupon under this subsection shall only authorize the
11	holder of the bear coupon to take not more than one (1)
12	brown or black bear or grizzly bear that is in an area
13	where the licensee would be authorized to take an elk as
14	designated by the elk license. If any licensee takes a bear
15	pursuant to a coupon under this subsection, the licensee
16	shall:
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18	(i) Attach the bear coupon to the carcass of the
19	bear as provided in W.S. 23-3-104;
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21	(ii) As soon as practicable, notify the game and
22	fish commission of the time, place and manner of the taking
23	of the bear;

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1 2 (iii) If the bear is a grizzly bear, provide any 3 additional information required by the game and fish 4 commission to ensure that a sustainable population of grizzly bears is maintained within the Yellowstone recovery 5 6 area. 7 8 Section 2. 9 10 (a) The legislature finds that grizzly bears have recovered in Wyoming and should be removed from the 11 12 endangered species and threatened species list and that the state should be responsible for management of grizzly bears 13 14 in Wyoming. 15 Not later than July 1, 2025 and prior to issuing 16 (b) 17 any bear coupon in accordance with W.S. 23-3-105(d) as created by section 1 of this act, the game and fish 18 commission shall present all evidence to the United States 19 20 fish and wildlife service supporting the fact that grizzly 21 bears have recovered in Wyoming and should be removed from 22 the endangered species and threatened species list and that

the state should be responsible for management of grizzly
 bears in Wyoming.

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4 (c) Nothing in this act shall be deemed to allow any 5 taking of grizzly bears within the greater Yellowstone 6 ecosystem recovery zone as established by the United States 7 fish and wildlife service.

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9 Section 3. The Wyoming game and fish commission shall 10 adopt any rules necessary to implement this act not later 11 than January 1, 2026.

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3	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
4	section, this act is effective immediately upon completion
5	of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided
б	by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
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8	(b) Section 1 of this act is effective on the earlier
9	of the following dates:
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11	(i) Ten (10) days after the date that the
12	Wyoming game and fish commission certifies to the secretary
13	of state that grizzly bears have been removed from the
14	endangered species and threatened species list;
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16	(ii) January 1, 2026.
