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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 Section 1.

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11 (a) As used in this act:

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(i) "Appropriation" means the authorizations granted by
the legislature under this act to make expenditures from and to
incur obligations against the general fund and other funds as
specified;

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1 2 (ii) "FF" means federal funds; 3 4 (iii) "PR" means private funding sources; 5 6 (iv) "SR" means an agency's account within the special revenue fund; 7 8 (v) "S0" means other funds identified by footnote; 9 10 11 (vi) "S13" means the strategic investments and projects 12 account. 13 14 (b) Appropriations for projects in this act remain in effect until the project is completed, unless otherwise provided. The 15 16 amounts appropriated for projects under this act shall be expended only on the projects specified and any unexpended, unobligated 17 funds remaining upon completion of a project shall revert to the 18 19 accounts from which they were appropriated, unless otherwise 20 provided. The amounts appropriated in this act are intended to 21 provide a maximum amount for each project from any source

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excluding contingency funding and shall not be construed to be an

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entitlement or guaranteed amount.
