A BILL

for

1 ACT relating to the legislature; authorizing AN the legislature to prosecute actions involving the proper 2 administration and interpretation of federal acts; making 3 conforming amendments; authorizing the management council 4 to initiate litigation upon a majority vote; providing 5 6 legislative findings; providing an appropriation; and 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 28-8-114 by creating a new subsection (b), by amending and renumbering (b) as (c), by renumbering (c) as (d), by amending and renumbering (d) as (e) and by a creating new subsection (f) is amended to read:

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28-8-114. Legal actions authorized; employment of
 counsel; creation of an account; authorizing the use of
 funds.

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(b) The legislature finds that article 1, section 8 5 and article 4, section 3 of the United States constitution 6 7 recognizes the jurisdiction of the Wyoming legislature over 8 land within the boundaries of the state of Wyoming. The Wyoming act of admission in section 1 recognizes that the 9 10 state of Wyoming is admitted into the union upon equal 11 footing with the original states in all respects whatsoever. Being a coequal branch of government, the 12 legislature finds that federal land use plans within the 13 state of Wyoming are matters of great public interest and 14 importance. The legislature has a sufficient interest in 15 16 the proper interpretation and administration of the 17 National Environmental Policy Act, the Federal Land Policy and Management Act, the National Historic Preservation Act, 18 19 the Endangered Species Act, the Clean Air Act, the Clean 20 Water Act and other federal acts to provide standing for 21 the legislature to prosecute actions for declaratory 22 judgment to protect its interests and the interests of the 23 public.

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2 (b)(c) The legislature by a majority vote of the 3 members of both houses when in session, or the management 4 5 majority of the members of the council during the interim, is authorized to commence and prosecute an action for б declaratory judgment in the courts of this state, or of the 7 8 United States, when such action is deemed necessary or 9 advisable to protect the rights, powers and interests of 10 legislature or assure proper interpretation the or 11 administration of the constitution, statutes, or 12 administrative rules and federal acts, including federal 13 purchases of land within the state of Wyoming. The legislature shall have standing and may use funds for 14 litigation purposes in accordance with subsection (f) of 15 16 this section to prosecute actions for declaratory judgment.

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18 (c)(d) The legislature may by resolution direct the 19 management council to prosecute an action. The management 20 council may commence an action upon its own motion.

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22 (d)(e) The legislature or the management council may
23 direct the legal staff of the legislative service office to

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1 commence and prosecute the an action, or it may employ
2 private counsel for such purposes, as it deems advisable.
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4 (f) The management council, on behalf of the
5 legislature, is authorized to utilize an amount not to
6 exceed seventy-five million dollars (\$75,000,000.00) at any
7 one (1) time, or however much is available, to take any of
8 the actions specified in this section.

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10 **Section 2.** There is appropriated seventy-five million 11 dollars (\$75,000,000.00) from the general fund to the 12 legislative service office for litigation purposes for the legislature as specified in this act. This appropriation 13 shall be for the period beginning with the effective date 14 of this act and ending June 30, 2028. This appropriation 15 16 shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose 17 and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30, 18 19 2028.

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21 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2025.
