Notwithstanding W.S. 9-2-1008 and 9-4-207, any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this appropriations shall not revert. This appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose. The appropriation in this subsection shall only be effective if 2025 Senate File 0099 is enacted into law.

(d) The department of state parks and cultural resources, in consultation with the governor, is authorized to enter into a memorandum of understanding, memorandum of agreement or contract for the development, siting, construction, operation and maintenance of the Wyoming state shooting complex. (ii) After the fourth year of operation, any revenue from operation of the Wyoming state shooting complex in excess of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) more than the annual operating cost shall be used to reduce the state share of expenditures for operation and maintenance in a ratio of one dollar (\$1.00) of appropriated funds to not less than one dollar (\$1.00) of revenue, but not to exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) in a fiscal year;

(iii) State appropriated funds, including any amounts authorized for expenditure for the operation and maintenance under subsections (b) and (c) of this section, shall not exceed two hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000.00) for the operation and maintenance of the Wyoming state shooting complex in any one (1) fiscal year.

(e) It is the intent of the legislature that the department of state parks and cultural resources submit an exception request not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000.00) for matching funds for the operation and maintenance of the Wyoming state shooting complex for the immediately succeeding fiscal biennium from the Wyoming tourism reserve and projects account or from the general fund if funds are insufficient in the Wyoming tourism reserve and projects account.
