A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the administration of the government;
- 2 generally prohibiting diversity, equity and inclusion
- 3 efforts and mandates by state agencies and educational
- 4 institutions; conditioning the expenditure of appropriated
- 5 funds as specified; specifying applicability; and providing
- 6 for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-1014.4 and 21-16-2001 are created
- 11 to read:

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9-2-1014.4. Funds and expenditures for diversity,

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14 equity and inclusion efforts prohibited.

1 (a) As used in this section: 2 3 (i) "Diversity, equity and inclusion" includes 4 any of the following: 5 (A) Influencing hiring or 6 employment practices with respect to race, sex, color or ethnicity, 7 8 other than through the use of race and gender neutral practices in accordance with any applicable state and 9 federal law; 10 11 12 (B) Promoting differential treatment of or providing special benefits to persons on the basis of race, 13 color or ethnicity; 14 15 16 (C) Promoting policies or procedures 17 designed or implemented in reference to race, color or ethnicity, except for policies or procedures necessary to 18 19 comply with any state law, federal law or applicable court 20 order; 21 22 (D) Conducting trainings, programs or activities designed or implemented in reference to race, 23

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- 1 color, ethnicity or gender dysphonia, except for trainings,
- 2 programs or activities that are for the sole purpose of
- 3 ensuring compliance with state law, federal law or any
- 4 applicable court order.

- 6 (ii) "Entity" means any governmental unit,
- 7 special district, corporation, partnership or person that
- 8 will receive a legislative appropriation, directly or
- 9 indirectly, including agencies of the executive branch, the
- 10 offices of the five (5) statewide elected officials, the
- 11 legislature, the judiciary, community colleges, the
- 12 University of Wyoming, the Wyoming department of
- 13 transportation, the game and fish department, counties,
- 14 municipalities and school districts.

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- 16 (b) As a condition of receiving or expending any
- 17 monies or funds appropriated, each entity shall not expend
- 18 any appropriated funds or funds received from bequests,
- 19 charges, deposits, donations, endowments, fees, grants,
- 20 gifts, tuition and any other source for programs or

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21 activities that, unless federal law otherwise requires:

1 (i) Establish or maintain a diversity, equity 2 and inclusion office or program; 3 4 (ii) Hire or assign an employee or a contracted person to perform the duties associated with a diversity, 5 equity and inclusion office or program; 6 7 8 (iii) Compel, require, induce or solicit any person to provide or abide by a diversity, equity and 9 10 inclusion statement or give preferential treatment to any 11 person based on a diversity, equity or inclusion statement; 12 (iv) Give preference on the basis of race, sex, 13 color, ethnicity or national origin to an applicant for 14 employment, an employee or a participant in any function of 15 16 the entity; 17 18 (v) Require, as a condition of employment, 19 enrollment, a contract or the receipt of funds, the 20 participation in diversity, equity and inclusion training. 21 22 (c) Nothing in this section shall be construed to:

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(i) Prohibit the use or consideration of bona

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2 fide qualifications based on sex that are reasonably 3 necessary to the normal operation of public higher 4 education; 5 (ii) Prohibit the University of Wyoming or 6 Wyoming community colleges, or an employee thereof, from 7 8 submitting documentation or a statement for purposes of a 9 grant or to comply with accreditation requirements that: 10 11 (A) Highlights the university's or 12 college's work in supporting first-generation college 13 students, low-income students or underserved students; 14 (B) Certifies compliance with state 15 and 16 federal antidiscrimination laws. 17 (d) For purposes of this section, "diversity, equity 18 and inclusion office or program" shall not include: 19 20 21 (i) Academic course instruction; 22

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1	(ii) The completion or dissemination of
2	scholarly research or creative works by students, faculty
3	and other research personnel of the University of Wyoming
4	or Wyoming community colleges;
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6	(iii) An activity of a student organization
7	registered with or recognized by the University of Wyoming
8	or a Wyoming community college;
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10	(iv) Guest speakers or performers at the
11	University of Wyoming or a Wyoming community college on a
12	short-term engagement;
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14	(v) Data collection.
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16	ARTICLE 20
17	DIVERSITY RELATED INITIATIVES AND FUNDING
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19	21-16-2001. Prohibition on expenditure of funds for
20	diversity, equity and inclusion and critical race theory.
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(a) As used in this section:

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1 (i) "Constrain" means failure during any 2 semester or academic unit to provide sufficient open seats 3 in alternative courses for a student to complete or 4 progress toward completion of degree or program 5 requirements; 6 7 (ii) "Related content": 8 9 (A) Means content that does one (1) or more 10 of the following: 11 (I) Relates critical 12 theory, whiteness, systemic racism, institutional racism, 13 anti-racism, microaggressions, systemic bias, implicit 14 15 bias, unconscious bias, intersectionality, gender 16 dysphonia, social justice, cultural competence, allyship, 17 race-based reparations, race-based privilege, race-based 18 diversity, gender-based diversity, race-based equity, 19 gender-based equity, race-based inclusion or gender-based 20 inclusion to contemporary American society; 21 22 (II) Promotes the idea that racially laws, policies or institutions 23 neutral or colorblind

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1 perpetuate oppression, injustice, race-based privilege,

2 including white supremacy or white privilege, or inequity

3 by failing to actively differentiate on the basis of race,

4 sex or gender;

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6 (III) Promotes the differential

7 treatment of any person or groups based on race or

8 ethnicity in contemporary American society;

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10 (IV) Promotes the idea that a student

11 is biased on account of the student's race or sex.

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13 (B) Does not include identifying and

14 discussing historical movements, ideologies or instances of

15 racial hatred or discrimination, including but not limited

16 to slavery, Indian removal, the Holocaust or

17 Japanese-American internment.

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19 (iii) "Related course" means any course whose

20 course description, course overview, course objectives,

21 proposed student learning outcomes, written examinations or

22 written or oral assignments for which the student will

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- 1 receive a grade includes content on diversity, equity and
- 2 inclusion or critical race theory;

4 (iv) "Related practice":

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- 6 (A) Includes any requirement or guidance
- 7 that a course instructor include or curate materials on the
- 8 basis of race, sex or gender dysphonia;

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- 10 (B) Includes participating in any workshop,
- 11 training, seminar or professional development on any
- 12 related content;

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- 14 (C) Does not include any programming
- 15 explicitly required by, and limited to, the institutional
- 16 obligations to comply with state or federal law or an
- 17 applicable court order.

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- 19 (b) In prescribing the studies to be pursued at the
- 20 University of Wyoming or a Wyoming community college, the
- 21 board of trustees of the University of Wyoming and the
- 22 district boards of each community college shall establish
- 23 curricula and designate courses in a manner that does not

- 1 require or constrain students to expend tuition or other
- 2 funds on, or enroll in, a related course in order to
- 3 satisfy the requirements of any academic degree program,
- 4 including general education, major, minor or certificate
- 5 requirements, subject to subsection (d) of this section.

- 7 (c) The board of trustees of the University of
- 8 Wyoming and the district boards of each community college,
- 9 or any employee or professional thereof, shall not require,
- 10 solicit or incentivize faculty or students to apply or
- 11 participate in related practices, or include related
- 12 content in any course, as a condition of approval,
- 13 designation or listing as part of any academic degree
- 14 program, including general education, major, minor or
- 15 certificate requirements or as a condition of consideration
- 16 in any faculty member's performance assessment, tenure,
- 17 salary adjustment or any other incentive, subject to
- 18 subsection (d) of this section.

- 20 (d) Academic degree program requirements of any
- 21 major, minor, certificate or department whose title clearly
- 22 establishes its course of study as primarily focused on
- 23 racial, ethnic or gender studies may be exempted from the

- 1 requirements of subsections (a) and (b) of this section in
- 2 writing by the board of trustees or the district board, as
- 3 applicable, subject to the following:

- 5 (i) No student shall be required or constrained
- 6 to enroll in any exempted program, department or course to
- 7 satisfy the requirements of any other academic degree
- 8 program, including general education requirements or any
- 9 other major, minor or certificate requirements;

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- 11 (ii) Courses offered or listed by or under
- 12 exempted programs shall satisfy the academic degree program
- 13 requirements of the exempted departments, majors, minors or
- 14 certificates only and shall not be used to satisfy degree
- 15 requirements for general education or other major, minor or
- 16 certificate requirements beyond satisfying credit-hour
- 17 graduation requirements;

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- 19 (iii) The title of any currently established
- 20 department, major, minor or certificate program shall not
- 21 be altered or replaced to establish an emphasis on racial,
- 22 ethnic or gender studies.

Section 2.

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3 (a) This act shall apply to all funds that are

4 appropriated or received on and after the effective date of

5 this act.

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7 (b) Nothing in this act shall be construed to alter,

8 amend or impair any contract or other agreement entered

9 into before the effective date of this act.

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11 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

14 Constitution.
