Emergency assistance immunity-mental health services.

1 AN ACT relating to civil procedure; amending the exemption from civil liability for providing emergency services to 2 include mental health crises; and providing 3 for an effective date. 4 5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: б 7 8 Section 1. W.S. 1-1-120(a) and (b) is amended to 9 read: 10 11 1-1-120. Persons rendering emergency assistance 12 exempt from civil liability. 13 14 (a) Any person licensed as a physician and surgeon 15 under the laws of the state of Wyoming, or any other

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1 person, who in good faith renders emergency care or 2 assistance, including assistance for a mental health 3 <u>crisis</u>, without compensation at the place of an emergency, 4 <u>or</u> accident <u>or mental health crisis</u>, is not liable for any 5 civil damages for acts or omissions in good faith.

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7 (b) Persons or organizations operating volunteer 8 ambulances or rescue vehicles supported by public or 9 private funds, staffed by unpaid volunteers, and which make 10 no charge, or charge an incidental service or user fee, for 11 services rendered during medical emergencies or mental 12 health crises, and the unpaid volunteers who staff ambulances and rescue vehicles are not liable for any civil 13 damages for acts or omissions in good faith in furnishing 14 emergency medical services or services during mental health 15 16 crises. This immunity does not apply to acts or omissions 17 constituting gross negligence or willful or wanton misconduct. For purposes of this section, "unpaid 18 volunteers" means persons who either receive incidental 19 20 remuneration on a per call basis or receive no more than 21 one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) annually for volunteer ambulance and rescue activities, including mental health 22 23 services or services provided during a suicidal

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1 intervention. The immunity provided by this subsection 2 shall extend to a physician while serving in his capacity 3 as medical director of any ambulance service, to hospitals 4 and hospital employees for activities directly related to 5 providing clinical training as part of an emergency medical service class approved by the department of health, and to 6 students while participating in emergency medical services 7 8 or mental health services training approved by the department of health. If an unpaid volunteer's, medical 9 10 director's, hospital's or trainee's acts or omissions are 11 subject to the provisions of the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, immunity under this section is waived to the 12 13 extent of the maximum liability provided under W.S. 1-39-118. 14 15
