7 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-39-124 is created to read:

9 1-39-124. Liability; parental rights.

11 A governmental entity is liable for damages resulting from

12 a violation of W.S. 14-2-206.

- 1 **Section 2**. W.S. 1-39-104(a) and 14-2-206 by creating
- 2 a new subsection (d) are amended to read:

- 4 1-39-104. Granting immunity from tort liability;
- 5 liability on contracts; exceptions.

- 7 (a) A governmental entity and its public employees
- 8 while acting within the scope of duties are granted
- 9 immunity from liability for any tort except as provided by
- 10 W.S. 1-39-105 through 1-39-112, 1-39-122 and 1-39-123 and
- 11 1-39-122 through 1-39-124. Any immunity in actions based on
- 12 a contract entered into by a governmental entity is waived
- 13 except to the extent provided by the contract if the
- 14 contract was within the powers granted to the entity and
- 15 was properly executed and except as provided in W.S.
- $16 \quad 1-39-120(b)$. The claims procedures of W.S. 1-39-113 apply
- 17 to contractual claims against governmental entities.

- 22 (d) A person whose parental right as provided under
- 23 this section has been infringed or will be infringed in

	violation of this section may assert the violation of
2	impending violation as a claim or defense in a judicial or
3	administrative proceeding, regardless of whether the state
4	or one of its political subdivisions is a party to the
5	proceeding. The person asserting the claim or defense may
6	obtain appropriate relief, including relief against the
7	state or its political subdivisions. Appropriate relief
8	includes, but is not limited to, injunctive relief,
9	declaratory relief, compensatory damages and costs and
10	attorney fees.

12	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2025.
