1 The board of land commissioners, after (b) 2 consultation as appropriate with the department 3 agriculture, the department of environmental quality, the 4 game and fish department, the oil and gas conservation department of transportation and 5 commission, the Wyoming wildlife and natural resource trust account board, 6 7 shall adopt rules for the establishment and administration of a compensatory mitigation credit system for greater sage 8 9 grouse in Wyoming, including rules for ecological functions, services and values. The rules shall 10 11 at a minimum provide for: 12 13 (vi) Criteria for other forms of mitigation, including operator-offered measures and operator-offered 14 restoration credits, in accordance with subsection (f) of 15 16 this section, and measures for reduced or eliminated take; 17 18 (f) In lieu of or in addition to the compensatory 19 mitigation credit system provided in this act, an operator 20 may perform compensatory mitigation measures in a service 21 area that includes the same or reasonably equivalent 22 properties in Wyoming to the lands where impacts occur and receive credit from the board of land commissioners for 23

3 expected impact. The operator shall not delegate the

4 responsibility for the mitigation measures except to a

9 for compensatory mitigation activities specified in this

10 act.

13 promulgate all rules necessary to implement this act.
