A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the administration of the government;  
2 specifying requirements and limitations for supplemental  
3 budget requests; repealing a provision regarding the  
4 preparation of alternative budgets; making conforming  
5 amendments; and providing for an effective date.

7 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-1013(d) by creating a new  
10 paragraph (vii) is amended to read:

11

12 **9-2-1013. State budget; distribution of copies to**  
13 **legislators; copies and reports of authorizations;**  
14 **interfund loans.**

1 (d) In addition to the items contained in subsection  
2 (a) of this section and notwithstanding any other  
3 recommendations made by the governor, the state budget  
4 shall also include the governor's recommendations for  
5 appropriations for the ensuing two (2) years, or if a  
6 supplemental budget, ~~request,~~ the remainder of the budget  
7 period, subject to the following:

8

9 (vii) Any recommendations in a supplemental  
10 budget from the governor or agencies shall be limited to  
11 the following recommendations for amendments to the state  
12 budget:

13

14 (A) Necessary reductions occasioned by the  
15 most recent published consensus revenue estimating group  
16 estimate of revenue shortfalls;

17

18 (B) Appropriations necessitated by human or  
19 natural disasters;

20

21 (C) Appropriations necessitated by public  
22 welfare emergencies as defined by W.S. 9-2-1002(a)(xxv) for

1 which amounts appropriated for public welfare emergencies  
2 under W.S. 9-2-1014.3 are insufficient;

4 (D) Recommendations regarding increases or  
5 decreases to savings;

6

7 (E) Necessary personnel adjustments.

8

9 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-2-1013(d)(vi) is repealed.

10

11 **Section 3.** This act is effective July 1, 2025.
