Description of Appropriation:

The appropriation is for two full-time positions. The first position is in Division 0200 and the second position is in Division 0300. Both positions are classified as ENNR11.

Assumptions:

The Department of Environmental Quality's assumption is that the proposed bill does not include any sampling and/or analysis, only a literature review and coordination with state and federal agencies.

The passage of this bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the administration of the Wyoming Water Development Office. The bill, as drafted, provides an exclusion for cloud seeding authorized by law. The Wyoming Water Development Office's annual Cloud Seeding Operations are authorized through the annual Omnibus Water Bill - Construction.
