**Description of appropriation:**

\$181,000 is appropriated from the General Fund to the Office of State Lands and Investments (OSLI) to cover increases in the employer-paid pension plan contributions for employees in correctional forestry crew supervision or wildland firefighting occupations. This appropriation is for 2027-28 biennium and is to be included in the standard budget for the 2029-2030 biennium.

Current employees in these occupations may elect to move from the Public Employee pension plan to either the Law Enforcement pension plan or the Guard Firefighter pension plan.

The contribution rates to the Law Enforcement pension plan and the Guard Firefighter pension plan are higher than the Public Employee pension plan. As a result, the Wyoming Retirement System will receive increased revenue in the affected plans, depending on elections made by current employees. As employees vest in these plans and become eligible for pension benefits, expenditures from the corresponding pension plans will increase.
