

FISCAL NOTE

Indeterminable impacts from this bill may extend to several agencies because the bill applies to the state and all its agencies, instrumentalities, and institutions.

The fiscal impact to the judicial system is indeterminable due to an unknown number of cases.

The Attorney General's Office indicates an indeterminable administrative impact due to an unknown number of investigations.

The Department of Transportation indicates an indeterminable fiscal impact. The Department of Transportation currently provides license plate data to out-of-state tolling authorities for a fee, allowing out-of-state tolling authorities to invoice Wyoming drivers directly. The bill may create an administrative impact by redirecting invoices from out-of-state tolling authorities to the Department of Transportation, requiring additional staff to manage volume, and research and resolve third-party billing issues on behalf of Wyoming residents.

The Department of Administration and Information indicates an indeterminable administrative impact.
