

**FISCAL NOTE**

These costs may be considered administrative costs but are listed here for consistency.

The Department of Workforce Services has indicated that the proposed bill, which lowers the regulatory impact analysis threshold to \$200,000, would create an indeterminable administrative impact by requiring additional expenditures to determine a rule's transactional costs.

The Department of Environmental Quality has indicated that the proposed bill may result in an indeterminable increase in personnel and expenditures.

The Game and Fish Department has indicated an increase in administrative time to meet reporting requirements for major rules.
