A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the legislature; requiring the
 2 legislative service office to direct email correspondence
 3 to a legislators email inbox if requested after
 4 verification that the correspondence does not pose a
 5 security threat; and providing for an effective date.

7 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

9 **Section 1.** W.S. 28-8-105 by creating a new subsection
 10 (e) is amended to read:

12 **28-8-105. Duties of director and staff; prefiling**
 13 **bills; fiscal notes.**

2 (e) Upon request, the legislative service office
3 shall confirm whether the requestor's email communications
4 to a legislator were filtered by the legislature's email
5 system to a folder other than the legislator's inbox. If
6 the requestor's email communications were filtered to a
7 folder other than a legislator's inbox by the legislature's
8 email system, the person may request that the legislative
9 service office direct all current and future email
10 communications from the requestor's identified email
11 addresses to a legislator's inbox. The legislative service
12 office shall, after verification of the email addresses
13 ensure the requestor's current and future email
14 communications are directed to a legislator's inbox within
15 two (2) business days of receipt of the request unless the
16 delivery of the email communications pose an actual,
17 articulable security threat to the legislature's email
18 system. This subsection shall only apply to email
19 communications that were filtered by the legislature's
20 email system without intervention of the end-user through
21 spam, security or other system-wide filtering.
