A JOINT RESOLUTION

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to introduce a bill
- 2 and enact law to increase the state of Wyoming's share of
- 3 federal mineral royalties from fifty percent (50%) to eighty-
- 4 seven and one-half percent (87.5%).

5

- 6 WHEREAS, in Wyoming, approximately forty-six percent (46%) of
- 7 the surface land area is owned by the federal government; and

8

- 9 WHEREAS, under the federal Mineral Leasing Act, fifty percent
- 10 (50%) of all money received from sales, bonuses, royalties
- 11 and rentals from federal mineral leasing is distributed to
- 12 the states where the lands or deposits are located, excluding
- 13 Alaska; and

1 WHEREAS, under the federal Mineral Leasing Act, Alaska

- 2 receives ninety percent (90%) of all money received from
- 3 sales, bonuses, royalties and rentals from federal mineral
- 4 leasing; and

5

- 6 WHEREAS, in fiscal year 2024, Wyoming received five hundred
- 7 ninety million nine hundred twenty thousand nine hundred
- 8 seventy-one dollars (\$590,920,971.00) in federal mineral
- 9 royalties; and

10

- 11 WHEREAS, Congress enacted into law the One Big Beautiful Bill
- 12 Act on July 4, 2025; and

13

- 14 WHEREAS, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act reduces the federal
- 15 mineral royalty rate for oil and gas leasing on federal lands
- 16 from sixteen and sixty-seven hundredths percent (16.67%) to
- 17 twelve and one-half percent (12.5%); and

18

- 19 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rate on
- 20 oil and gas leasing on federal lands is estimated to reduce
- 21 Wyoming's state share of federal mineral royalties by
- 22 approximately six hundred thousand dollars (\$600,000.00) in

1 fiscal year 2026, increasing annually to approximately four

2 million dollars (\$4,000,000.00) in fiscal year 2030; and

3

4 WHEREAS, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act reduces the federal

5 mineral royalty rate for coal leasing on federal lands from

6 twelve and one-half percent (12.5) to seven percent (7%); and

7

8 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rate on

9 coal leasing on federal lands is estimated to reduce Wyoming's

10 state share of federal mineral royalties by approximately

11 fifty million dollars (\$50,000,000.00) annually until 2034;

12 and

13

14 WHEREAS, the reduction in the federal mineral royalty rates

15 will reduce the revenues available for Wyoming's roads,

16 bridges and highways, kindergarten through grade twelve (12)

17 education, higher education, capital construction, emergency

18 responders and general operations of government; and

19

20 WHEREAS, transportation, education and emergency response

21 resources are vital to Wyoming and its citizens.

1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE

2 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

4 **Section 1.** That the Wyoming Legislature requests that

5 Congress introduce and enact legislation that will increase

6 the state of Wyoming's share of federal mineral royalties

7 from fifty percent (50%) to eighty-seven and one-half percent

8 (87.5%).

9

10 Section 2. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

11 transmit copies of this resolution to the President of the

12 United States, to the President of the Senate and the Speaker

13 of the House of Representatives of the United States Congress

14 and to the Wyoming Congressional Delegation.
