A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to elections; clarifying the procedure for
- 2 testing voting machines and electronic voting systems;
- 3 specifying that tests shall be open to the public;
- 4 specifying rulemaking authority; removing the presumption
- 5 of proper preparation of voting machines; and providing for
- 6 an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 22-10-108, 22-10-110, 22-11-103(c)
- 11 and 22-11-104(b)(iii) are amended to read:

13 22-10-108. Procedure for preparing machines for

14 election; inspection and certification.

1 Before preparing a voting machine for (a) an 2 election, the county clerk shall, not later than five (5) 3 days before a test of a voting machine or not later than 4 twenty-four (24) hours before any re-test of a voting machine, post a public notice in the office of the county 5 clerk and on the website of the county clerk and notify in 6 writing the county chairman of each political party having 7 8 a candidate on the ballot and all independent candidates, stating the time and place where the voting machine will be 9 election. 10 prepared for the The political party 11 representatives and representatives of independent 12 candidates Members of the public may be present at the preparation of the voting machine for the election, to see 13 14 that the machine is tested for accuracy and is properly prepared and that all registering counters are set at zero 15 16 (00000). The county clerk, in the presence of these 17 representatives attendees, shall prepare the voting machine for the election and set all registering counters at zero 18 19 (00000). He shall then test each registering counter for 20 accuracy by casting votes on it until the registering counter is correctly registering each vote cast on it. The 21 22 county clerk shall then reset each registering counter to 23 zero (00000) and shall immediately lock and seal the voting

1 machine with a numbered metal seal and make a record of the

2 number of the seal on the certificate for the machine. The

3 seal shall be so placed as to prevent operation of the

4 machine or its registering counters without breaking the

5 seal. The county clerk shall then immediately make a record

6 on the certificate for the machine of the reading shown on

7 the protective counter.

8

9 Inspection of voting machines may shall begin not less than two (2) weeks before an election and continue 10 11 until all machines to be used are publicly tested and 12 sealed. Immediately following testing of a machine, the county clerk shall make a certificate in writing stating 13 the serial number of each machine, whether the machine has 14 all the registering counters set at zero (00000), and 15 16 whether the machine has been tested by voting on each 17 registering counter to prove that each registering counter is in perfect and accurate condition, the number registered 18 19 on the protective counter, and the number on the seal with 20 which the machine is sealed against operation. This 21 certificate shall be filed with the secretary of state and 22 a copy shall be kept on file in the office of the county 23 clerk.

1 2 (c) No voting machine shall be used in any election 3 unless the individual machine is tested and prepared in 4 accordance with this section. Every voting machine used in an election, including but not limited to all electronic 5 ballot marking devices, shall be individually tested. 6 7 8 22-10-110. Objections. 9 10 A voting machine prepared for an election and certified by 11 the county clerk shall be conclusively presumed to be

14 the election if a complaint is filed in the district court

21 necessary promulgate rules and regulations consistent with
22 subsection (a) of this section and with all other
23 requirements of this Election Code to govern the

- 2 used in Wyoming. The rules shall ensure the fairness and
- 3 accuracy of elections. The rules may govern both the
- 4 characteristics of the systems and the procedures to be
- 5 followed in testing and using the systems. The rules shall
- 6 allow the county clerks to follow appropriate
- 7 recommendations of the vendors of the systems for
- 8 maintenance and management of the systems to the extent
- 9 these recommendations are not inconsistent with this
- 10 Election Code and with the rules. The rules shall be

- 23 voting system, post a public notice in the office of the

1 assigned to each candidate, including write-in candidates, 2 for an office, and for and against each measure, including 3 at least one (1) undervote and one (1) overvote in each 4 race or measure in each precinct and in each county. If any error is detected, or if the test is not completed in 5 compliance with law, the cause of it shall be ascertained 6 7 and corrected and an errorless count shall be secured and 8 certified to by the county clerk. On completion of the count, the results, reported in the same manner official 9 10 election results are reported, shall be retained by the 11 county clerk, posted to the county clerk's website and a 12 copy of the results, reported in the same manner official election results are reported, shall be provided to any 13 person upon request. The programs, test materials and 14 15 ballots shall be sealed and retained as provided for paper 16 ballots, provided that if a re-test is required the seals 17 may be broken so that an errorless count can be secured and 18 certified as provided in this paragraph;

Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
