Waste and storm water infrastructure study.

Sponsored by: Select Water Committee

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to water; requiring a study of waste water
2 and storm water infrastructure in the state as specified;
3 requiring reports; providing an appropriation; and
4 providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.**

9

10 (a) The department of environmental quality shall
11 enter into a memorandum of understanding or amend an
12 existing memorandum of understanding with the office of
13 state lands and investments to conduct a study to collect
14 information on public waste water and storm water
15 infrastructure in the state. This study shall be conducted
16 in conjunction with the ongoing efforts by the department

1 of environmental quality to collect information on all
2 drinking water infrastructure in the state.

3

4 (b) The office of state lands and investments and the
5 Wyoming water development office shall coordinate with and
6 provide any necessary assistance to the department of
7 environmental quality in conducting the study required
8 under subsection (a) of this section. Each city, town,
9 special district and county shall provide any data or
10 information on its water, waste water and storm water
11 infrastructure as requested by the department of
12 environmental quality or its designee for the study
13 required under subsection (a) of this section.

14

15 (c) The department of environmental quality shall
16 report the status of the study required under subsection
17 (a) of this section to the select water committee not later
18 than November 1 of each year beginning in 2026 and ending
19 in 2030.

20

21 (d) There is appropriated eight million dollars
22 (\$8,000,000.00) from the strategic investments and projects
23 account to the office of state lands and investments for

1 any expenditures necessary to conduct the study required by
2 subsection (a) of this section. Funds appropriated under
3 this subsection may be used to retain a consultant to
4 assist with the completion of the study. This appropriation
5 shall be for the period beginning with the effective date
6 of this act and ending June 30, 2030. This appropriation
7 shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose
8 and any unexpended, unobligated funds remaining from this
9 appropriation shall revert as provided by law on June 30,
10 2030. It is the intent of the legislature that this
11 appropriation not be included in the office of state lands
12 and investments' standard budget for the immediately
13 succeeding fiscal biennium.

15 **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2026.
