for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the emergency expenses of government regarding local tourism; providing a reappropriation for 2 local tourism marketing and visitor 3 impact services; providing for distribution of the funds; providing for 4 5 audits of the recipients of funds, providing rule making 6 authority; and providing for an effective date. 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8

| 1  | (a) There is reappropriated to the Wyoming office of        |

| 2  | tourism five million dollars (\$5,000,000.00) from any      |
| 3  | federal funds appropriated in 2020 Wyoming Special Session  |

| 6  | to be distributed by the office of tourism as specified by  |
| 7  | subsection (b) of this section. If a COVID-19 relief        |

| 9  | deposit of COVID-19 related emergency response funds, this  |
| 10 | reappropriation shall be made from that account. The funds  |
| 11 | reappropriated under this section shall only be distributed |

| 13 | section and consistent with the terms of the federal gift,  |

4 subject to any limitations imposed by 2020 Wyoming Special

5 Session Laws, Chapter 1. Any unobligated, unexpended funds

6 remaining from this reappropriation on or after December

7 31, 2020 shall revert as provided by law.

In consultation with the department of revenue, 9 10 office of tourism shall distribute the the reappropriated under subsection (a) of this section to the 11 12 treasurer of each county, city or town imposing a lodging 13 tax as authorized by W.S. 39-15-204(a)(ii). Each treasurer receiving funds under this section shall only use the funds 14 as authorized by subsection (c) of this section. Consistent 15 16 with the distribution allocation provided by W.S. 39-15-17 211(a)(ii)(B), the office of tourism shall use the lodging tax collected in each county, city or town in fiscal year 18 19 2019 to determine the proportionate share each county, city 20 or town shall receive under this section. No funds shall be 21 deducted by the office of tourism to defray administrative costs and the office of tourism shall distribute the funds 22

- 1 as one (1) lump sum payment to each entity and not through
- 2 a monthly distribution.

- 4 (c) The treasurer of each county, city or town
- 5 receiving a distribution under subsection (b) of this
- 6 section shall only use the funds as authorized by the
- 7 federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security
- 8 (CARES) Act, P.L. No. 116-136, to reimburse the county,
- 9 city or town for actual expenses incurred or that will be
- 10 incurred due to the public health emergency caused by
- 11 COVID-19 and only in the following amounts and for the
- 12 following purposes:

- 14 (i) Seventy percent (70%) shall be used to
- 15 reimburse expenses related to the promotion of travel and
- 16 tourism within the county, city or town imposing the
- 17 lodging tax and in accordance with W.S. 39-15-
- 18 211(a)(ii)(B)(I);

- 20 (ii) Thirty percent (30%) shall be used to
- 21 reimburse expenses related to the provision of visitor
- 22 impact services within the county, city or town imposing
- 23 the lodging tax. If the lodging tax was imposed countywide

1 through a joint powers board, the county treasurer shall 2 distribute an amount to the county in the proportion that 3 the lodging tax collected outside the corporate limits of 4 its cities and towns bears to the total amount of lodging tax collected within the county, and to incorporated cities 5 and towns within the county in the proportion that the 6 lodging tax collected within the corporate limits of each 7 8 city and town bears to the total amount collected within 9 the county, provided that the funds shall only be used for 10 the provision of visitor impact services as specified in this paragraph. As used in this paragraph, "visitor impact 11 12 services" defined by W.S. 39-15means as

(e) The office of tourism may conduct and contract 15 16 for random audits of any county, city or town receiving 17 funds under this section to ensure funds are expended in compliance with state and federal law. Any county, city or 18 19 town receiving funds under this section shall repay all 20 funds provided under this section if the county, city or 21 town uses any funds for expenses not authorized by this section; 22

1 (d) In consultation with the department of revenue,

2 the office of tourism shall promulgate any rules necessary

3 to administer this act.

4

5 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon

6 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 7

8 Constitution.
