3	(b) A board authorized to establish examination,
4	inspection, permit or license fees for any profession or
5	occupation regulated under this title or under W.S. 11-25-
6	105, 21-2-802 or 23-2-414 may waive or modify statutory
7	examination and continuing education requirements for
8	licensure or permitting if:
9	
10	(i) The examination is not being given or is not
11	practicably available; or
12	
13	(ii) Continuing education opportunities are not
14	practicably available.

16	(c) The relevant licensing or certifying authority may
17	impose reasonable or necessary restrictions or requirements
18	on a license, certification or practice authority affected
19	by a waiver or modification granted pursuant to subsection
20	(b) of this section.

22	(d) If the duration of a waiver or modification
23	granted pursuant to subsection (b) of this section exceeds
