- 1 AN ACT relating to cities, towns and counties; amending

 3 government meeting minutes and compensation information;

 6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1**. W.S. 15-1-110(a), (b)(intro) and (i) and

9 18-3-516(a), (b)(intro), (i) and (f) are amended to read:

1 15-1-110. Minutes of meetings and titles of 2 ordinances passed to be posted; contents; posting of salary 3 information of specified officials and employees.

5 The governing body of any city or town shall (a) designate a legal newspaper and, publish once therein 6 within twelve (12) days after any regular or special 7 8 meeting of the governing body of the city or town, post and maintain on its official website the minutes of all regular 9 10 and special meetings of the governing body and the titles 11 of all ordinances passed. If a newspaper is not published 12 in—the city or town does not have an official website the 13 proceedings or ordinances shall be posted for at least ten (10) days in the city or town clerk's office and in such 14 15 other places as the governing body determines. The clerk of 16 each city or town shall within twelve (12) days after 17 adjournment of every meeting, furnish the newspaper a copy 18 of the proceedings of the meeting. Except for salaries and wages published under subsection (b) of this section, the 19 20 copy post shall include any bill presented to the governing 21 body stating the amount of the bill, the amount allowed, the purpose of the bill and the claimant. Claims for part-22 23 time employees may be summarized by department without

1 listing each part-time employee. The newspaper shall 2 publish the copy of proceedings within nine (9) days after 3 receipt. 4 5 (b) A city or town required to publish post minutes to its official website under subsection (a) of this 6 section shall separately publish post on its official 7 8 website: 9 10 (i) Within sixty (60) days after the end of each fiscal year, the name, position, base annual salary of and 11 12 amount of overtime pay paid to each full-time employee and 13 each elected official. A brief statement shall accompany 14 the salary publication post specifying that all salaries 15 are listed as base annual salaries or actual wages, not 16 including any benefits such as health insurance costs, life insurance benefits and pension plans. The statement shall 17 also indicate that any overtime the employee earned and was 18 paid by the city or town is included. The city or town 19 20 shall maintain this information on its official website; 21 22 18-3-516. Posting of proceedings; posting of salary 23 information of certain officials and employees.

2	(a) Each board of county commissioners shall post a
3	comprehensive summary of the entire proceedings of all
4	regular and special meetings held by the board on the
5	county's official website in the manner provided in this
6	subsection. (f) of this section and publish the
7	comprehensive summary of the entire proceedings of all
8	regular and special meetings held by them one (1) time in
9	the county's designated official newspaper. The county
10	clerk of each county shall within twelve (12) working days
11	after adjournment of every meeting for which the next
12	scheduled meeting will be called to order in two (2) weeks
13	time or less, or within eighteen (18) working days after
14	adjournment of every meeting for which the next scheduled
15	meeting will be called to order in more than two (2) weeks
16	time, furnish the paper with a copy of the proceedings post
17	and maintain on the county's official website a
18	comprehensive summary of the proceedings. Except for
19	salaries and wages published under subsection (b) of this
20	section, the copy post shall include any bill presented to
21	the board stating the amount of the bill, the amount
22	allowed, the purpose of the bill and the claimant. Claims
23	for part-time employees may be summarized by department

1 without listing each part-time employee. The newspaper 2 shall publish the copy of proceedings within nine (9) days 3 after receipt. The board shall post on its official 4 website, and if practicable publish in the county's 5 designated official newspaper, notice of the time of all regular and special meetings. 6 7

8 (b) Each board of county commissioners shall post on 9 the county's official website: in the manner provided in 10 subsection (f) of this section and publish separate from 11 the minutes of the proceedings:

13 (i) Within sixty (60) days after the end of each 14 fiscal year, the name, position, base annual salary of and 15 amount of overtime pay paid to each full-time employee and each elected official. A brief statement shall accompany 16 the salary publication post specifying that all salaries 17 are listed as base annual salaries or actual wages, not 18 including any benefits such as health insurance costs, life 19 20 insurance benefits and pension plans. The statement shall 21 also indicate that any overtime that the employee earned and was paid by the county is included. The county shall 22 23 maintain this information on its official website.

2	(f) For all publications required by statute to be
3	posted on a county's official website, except as provided
4	in subsections (a) and (b) of this section, the publication
5	shall be posted at times required for publication in a
6	designated official newspaper. Until June 30, 2016, <u>In</u>
7	addition, each board of county commissioners shall cause to
8	be published in the designated official newspaper once per
9	month, no less than twelve (12) times per year, a general
10	public notice pertaining to access to county information.
11	After June 30, 2016, this general public notice shall be
12	published at least once per year.
