- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 31-7-110(b), 31-7-114(a) and
- 8 31-7-119(b) are amended to read:

10 31-7-110. Instruction and temporary driver's permits.

1	(b) Any person at least fifteen (15) years of age may
2	apply to the division for a motorcycle instruction permit.
3	The division, after the applicant has successfully passed a
4	written examination and a vision test has demonstrated
5	adequate visual acuity according to department rules, may
6	issue to the applicant an instruction permit which that
7	entitles the applicant to drive a motorcycle for a period
8	of ninety (90) days without a passenger. If the applicant
9	also passes a driving test, the division may issue an
10	instruction permit which that entitles the applicant to
11	drive a motorcycle for a period of one (1) year, without a
12	passenger. The motorcycle instruction permit for a person
13	who is under seventeen (17) years of age shall be subject
14	to restricted hours of operation as provided in W.S.
15	31-7-110(h)(ii)(B) through (E).

(a) The division shall examine every applicant for a driver's license and instructional permit and shall require each applicant to demonstrate adequate visual acuity 21 according to department rules. The division's examination 22 shall include a test of the applicant's eyesight, his 23

- 1 ability to read and understand official traffic control
- 2 devices, his and the applicant's knowledge of safe driving
- 3 practices, and the traffic laws of the state. and The
- 4 examination may also include an actual demonstration of
- 5 ability to exercise ordinary and reasonable control in the
- 6 operation of a motor vehicle of the type or class of
- 7 vehicles to be driven.

- 12 (b) The division shall require every person applying
- 13 for renewal of a driver's license to take and successfully
- 14 pass a test of his eyesight demonstrate adequate visual
- 15 acuity according to department rules. The division may
- 16 require any applicant to take and successfully pass any
- 17 additional tests or provide affidavits required or
- 18 authorized under the original application as the division
- 19 finds reasonably necessary to determine his-the applicant's
- 20 qualification according to the type or class of license.
- 21 The written test for a hazardous materials endorsement
- 22 shall be taken and passed if the person wants to retain an

1	"H" endorsement unless the applicant's written test results
2	are less than two (2) years old.

5	department of transportation shall promulgate rules to
6	accomplish the purposes of this act.

11	section, this act is effective immediately upon completion
12	of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided
13	by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
