9	if all safety belts in the rows of seats behind the front

11 12 (a) Any person who violates this article shall be issued a citation and fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) xxx dollars (\$xxx.00) for the first offense, provided that the fine shall be waived by the court upon receipt of proof by the court that the offender, after the offense occurred, has purchased, leased or otherwise acquired a child safety restraint system which meets the requirements of this article. For a second or subsequent violation of this article, the offender shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) yyy dollars (\$yyy.00).

(e) All citations for violations of the motor vehicle laws of this state and for violations of traffic ordinances or traffic regulations of a local authority shall contain a notation by the issuing officer indicating whether the driver and passengers complied with this section. Compliance with this section shall entitle a licensee to a ten dollar (\$10.00) reduction in the fine otherwise imposed by any court having jurisdiction over the alleged offense. The driver who violates this section may be issued a citation and may be subject to a fine of not more than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the driver and a fine of not more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) for each passenger under twelve (12) years of age allowed to violate this section. Any passenger who violates this section may be issued a citation and may be subject to a fine of not more than ten dollars (\$10.00) one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Any person who violates this section shall be required to complete a safe and defensive driving education course pursuant to department rules. *******************
