         (a) It is unlawful for the owner or any other person,
    employing or otherwise directing the driver of any vehicle

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1 to require or knowingly to permit the operation of the

2 vehicle upon a highway in any manner contrary to law.

(b) The department or <u>local authority may employ an</u> 4 automated vehicle identification system to detect a speed 5 <u>limit violation</u>, <u>size or weight limit violation or other</u> 6 violation that jeopardizes the safety and welfare of the 7 8 traveling public or highway authorities, contractors or employees in a school or construction zone. A recording of 9 10 the violation and images and data produced by the automated vehicle identification system shall be prima facie evidence 11 of the facts contained in the recording and shall be 12 admissible in a judicial or administrative proceeding to 13 adjudicate liability for the violation. If the identity of 14 the driver of a vehicle against whom a violation is 15 recorded under this subsection is unknown, the registered 16 owner of the vehicle recorded by the automated vehicle 17 identification system shall be fined an amount not to 18 19 exceed the statutory maximum amount for the violation plus 20 assessed fees and costs provided that:
