1 AN ACT relating to highways; establishing a road usage charge; providing for the distribution of funds; creating 2 penalties; providing for a fuel tax sunset; requiring 3 4 reporting; requiring rulemaking; and providing for 5 effective dates.

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STAFF COMMENT

This bill draft provides illustration for discussion purposes, but each section opens policy considerations, which WYDOT/WSP plans to explain at the September 2020 committee meeting. The bill draft has not been through the complete LSO internal review process, and technical or substantive changes may be required in addition to changes directed by the Committee. *****************

21	credit for fuel taxes. The department shall promulgate
22	rules consistent with the provisions of this article as
23	provided by the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act as

1 department shall create a (b) The state account 2 manager to oversee administration and enforcement of the 3 road usage charge program. This entity may be established 4 within the department using internal department resources or, if more economically feasible, may be a nongovernmental 5 entity contracted to perform in that capacity. The state 6 account manager shall collect road usage charge payments 7 8 and manage road usage charge accounts on behalf of the 9 state and shall deposit collected funds into the state 10 highway fund with receipt and acknowledgement submitted to 11 the state treasurer. 11	(a) The road usage charge assessed under
12	W.S. 24-8-203 shall be collected by the department or state
13	or commercial account manager together with interest of one
14	percent (1%) per month on the road usage charge from the
15	due date until payment.

17	(b) No person shall knowingly:

19	(i) Operate, nor shall an owner knowingly permit
20	to be operated, upon any highway any Wyoming registered
21	vehicle or any other vehicle participating in an applicable

(30) days or more or if any vehicle subject to the lien is

1 about to be removed from the state, the department or its

2 authorized enforcement agent may seize and sell the vehicle

3 subject to all existing liens and security interests held

5 lienholder of record as provided by Rule 4 of the Wyoming

6 Rules of Civil Procedure, and upon four (4) weeks notice of

(a) The department shall develop plans to integrate
Wyoming's road usage charge program into a larger regional
or national program if established. Plans shall include:
(i) Collaboration with other state departments
of transportation and the federal highway administration
necessary to implement appropriate agreed upon rules and
regulations;
(ii) Development of agreements to share vehicle
registration and mileage data with safeguards of ensuring
payer privacy and not sharing any personally identifying
information without consent;
(iii) Implementation of additional payer privacy
protections if required;
(iv) Other items the department may deem
important.

1 24-8-210. Fuel tax sunset.

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3 (a) Beginning March 31, 2022, the road usage charge 4 program shall supplement current fuel tax revenue to reduce the annual funding shortfalls the department, counties and 5 municipalities experience each year to raise and maintain 6 road surfaces and bridges. As revenue from fuel taxes 7 8 continues to decline based upon increase vehicle fuel 9 mileage and conversion to electric vehicle technology, the 10 pay by mile system shall eventually replace fuel taxes and 11 shall be the main funding mechanism to ensure a safe and 12 effective surface transportation system in Wyoming. To achieve a smooth transition from fuel taxes to the road 13 14 usage charge the department shall:

(i) Annually provide the joint revenue interim
committee, the joint transportation, highways and military
affairs interim committee and the joint appropriations
committee:

21 (A) An annual assessment on the 22 effectiveness of the road usage charge to eliminate revenue 23 shortfalls;

2	(B) Changes in rates necessary to cover
3	shortfalls;
4	
5	(C) Annual projections indicating reduction
6	in fuel taxes to meet the share of revenue replaced by the
7	road usage charge;
8	
9	(D) Recommendations on a fuel tax phase out
10	timeline and updates to that timeline when conditions
11	indicate it will likely change.
12	
13	(ii) Support regional and national efforts to
14	implement a road usage charge on a larger scale.
15	
16	(b) Until a regional or national road usage charge is
17	established and methods to collect a road usage charge on
18	vehicles registered outside of Wyoming is determined, fuel
19	taxes shall be set to approximate road usage charge per
20	mile charges to ensure that road usage charge registered
21	vehicles do not inappropriately share more of the burden
22	for transportation and highway revenue. The department

shall make recommendations for the appropriate fuel tax

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- 1 rates once vehicle road usage charge rates are established.
- Fuel tax rates shall also be indexed by rules consistent
- 3 with W.S. 24-8-204 to maintain alignment with road usage
- 4 charge rates until fuel taxes are replaced according to
- subsection (a) of this section. 5

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STAFF COMMENT

WYDOT's current annual funding shortfall is estimated to be at least \$135 million. To reduce the revenue shortage while the road usage charge is implemented and expanded (or if the committee determines not to implement a road usage charge), a section amending existing statutes to implement the following increases could be added to this bill draft and each would indicate a sunset once replaced by road usage charge revenue:

- a. A \$.05 increase in the Fuel Tax from \$.24 to \$.29 for gasoline, diesel and alternative fuels. This expected to raise \$22,295,000 annually for the department.
- b. A 0.5% to 1.0% increase in the state Sales Tax and dedicated to surface transportation requirements. This is expected to raise between \$52,247,946 and \$104,495,891 annually for the department.
- c. A \$5 increase in Vehicle Registration. expected to raise \$4,298,665 annually for the department.
- 25 d. Implementation of a 1% Vehicle Sales Tax. This expected to raise \$15,000,000 annually for the department. 26
