INTRODUCTION**

Military training memorials.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to honoring military members; authorizing  
2 the creation of memorials to military members who died in  
3 training accidents in Wyoming; authorizing expenditure of  
4 funds; and providing for an effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7

8       **Section 1.** The Wyoming department of transportation,  
9 in cooperation with appropriate nongovernmental  
10 organizations, may design and create memorials to honor  
11 United States military personnel who died in military  
12 training accidents in Wyoming during United States  
13 involvement in overseas wars. The department shall identify

1 appropriate locations accessible to the public along public  
2 roads, highways or parking areas for the placement of the  
3 memorials. The adjutant general of the Wyoming national  
4 guard shall approve the design of each memorial and the  
5 location at which the memorial is to be placed prior to the  
6 creation of the memorial.

8       **Section 2.** Subject to constitutional limitations, up  
9 to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00) of previously  
10 appropriated other state funds in 2020 Wyoming Session  
11 Laws, Chapter 80, Section 2, Section 045 and identified by  
12 the transportation commission as available for expenditure  
13 is authorized to be expended by the department of  
14 transportation during fiscal year 2022 for purposes of this  
15 act. Expenditure of other state funds authorized by this  
16 act to design, create or place a memorial is conditioned  
17 upon a match of funds in the ratio of three dollars (\$3.00)  
18 of other state funds to not less than one dollar (\$1.00) in  
19 matching funds from a nonstate entity for purposes of  
20 designing, creating and placing that memorial.

22       **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon  
23 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

1 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
2 Constitution.
