2 (c) Certification under this subsection shall allow 3 practice as a certified addictions practitioner only under 4 the supervision of a qualified clinical supervisor and subject to any other restrictions which may be specified by 5 The board shall grant certification as a 6 the board. certified addictions practitioner to any applicant who 7 8 files an application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied by the appropriate fee 9 10 and who furnishes satisfactory evidence to the board of the 11 following:

(iii) The applicant has received a baccalaureate 13 degree in a human resource behavioral discipline from a 14 15 regionally accredited institution of higher education, 16 which is professional in content and which meets the 17 academic and training content standards national standards for accreditation in the field of addiction therapy as 18 established by the board, or <a href="https://example.com/has/neceived">has received</a> a baccalaureate 19 20 level equivalency in addiction therapy. In performing its duties under this paragraph, the board shall use the 21 professional training and experience 22 standards of the national professional associations 23 appropriate as

5	of this subsection, a person who has received a
6	baccalaureate degree in a human behavioral discipline,

10	(2,000) hours of supervised work experience in the field of
