1 2 (d) Crimes committed under subsection $(a)_{\tau}$ or $(b)_{-\sigma r}$ 3 (c) of this section are punishable as follows: 4 40-27-101. Trespass to unlawfully collect resource 5 data; unlawful collection of resource data. б 7 8 (d) A person who trespasses to unlawfully collect 9 resource data_{τ} or a person who unlawfully collects resource 10 data or a person who trespasses to access adjacent or proximate land under this section shall be liable in a 11 12 civil action by the owner or lessee of the land for all 13 consequential and economic damages proximately caused by the trespass. In a civil action brought under this 14 15 section, in addition to damages, a successful claimant 16 shall be awarded litigation costs. For purposes of this 17 subsection, "litigation costs" shall include, but is are not limited to, court costs, expert witness fees, other 18 19 witness fees, costs associated with depositions and 20 discovery, reasonable attorney fees and the reasonably 21 necessary costs of identifying the trespasser, of obtaining effective service of process on the trespasser and of 22

successfully effecting the collection of any judgment 1 2 against the trespasser. 3 4 **Section 2.** W.S. 6-3-414(c) and 40-27-101(c) are repealed. 5 6 7 ***** 8 9 STAFF COMMENT 10 The repealed sections above were held unconstitutional by 11 the Tenth Circuit Court (of which Wyoming is a part) See 12 Western Watersheds Project v. Michael, 869 F.3d 1189 (10th 13 14 Cir. 2017) and Western Watersheds Project v. Michael, 353 15 F. Supp. 3d 1176 (D. Wyo. 2018). The statutes are 16 reproduced below: 17 18 6-3-414.
