

The emergency rules have now been approved for the WDTF Internship Grant, Business Training Grant, Pre-hire Economic Development Grant, and Apprenticeship Grant!

Business Training Grant limits increased from \$1,000 to \$4,000 per trainee, per state fiscal year. For preferred industries, limits increased from \$1,500 to \$5,000 per trainee, per state fiscal year.

A business entity is now eligible to apply for up to \$200,000 per state fiscal year.

Internship Grant funding limits increased from \$12/hr up to \$25/hr, supported by labor market industry averages.

Businesses can host up to 6 internships per SFY, based on demonstrated need, and the ability to offer quality work experience for each intern.

Pre-Hire Economic Development Grant changes make emergency medical service providers eligible to participate in Pre-Hire Economic Development Grants.

The Pre-Hire grant will continue to provide funding to obtain trained workers for a new or expanding business, in addition to now providing training funds to replace lost workers.

Apprenticeship Grant change adapts the performance measure to be more flexible for each specific apprenticeship program and its specific needs.

This grant is available to Wyoming-based Registered Apprenticeship Programs and its related technical Instruction providers to assist with the cost of the related instruction of the registered apprenticeship program.
