1 AN ACT relating to medical assistance and services; 2 temporarily extending Medicaid medical assistance to qualifying pregnant women for twelve (12) months 3 4 postpartum; making a conforming amendment; providing appropriations; requiring rulemaking; and providing for an 5 effective date. 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 9 10 Section 1. W.S. 42-4-122(b) by creating a new 11 paragraph (iii) is amended to read: 12

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1 42-4-122. Cooperation with paternity determination. 2 3 (b) The following persons are not required to 4 cooperate with the department pursuant to subsection (a) of 5 this section: 6 7 (iii) A person who has been pregnant within the 8 proceeding twelve (12) months. This paragraph is repealed 9 effective July 1, 2027. 10 11 Section 2. Pursuant to the authority granted by Sections 9812 and 9822 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 12 13 2021 (Pub. L. 117-2), the department of health shall apply 14 for state plan amendments to provide extended postpartum coverage to pregnant individuals enrolled in Medicaid 15 16 pursuant to the Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act or enrolled in the Child Health Insurance Plan. 17 Authorization for extended postpartum coverage under this 18 section shall end on March 31, 2027. 19 20 21 ***** 22 23 STAFF COMMENT

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1 questions at the June committee There were meeting 2 regarding whether Wyoming could extend postpartum coverage for less than a twelve month postpartum period. 3 According to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), 4 5 the extension is required to be a twelve month postpartum period and not less than that. 6

8 For now, the March 31, 2027 date is a placeholder for 9 further Committee consideration. CMS does not require that 10 this Medicaid postpartum extension last through March 31, 11 2027, but strongly encourages it. Please advise LSO staff 12 as to how long the Committee would like the extension to 13 last.

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Section 3. There is appropriated XXX 18 dollars (XXX,000.00) from the general fund and XXX 19 dollars 20 (XXX,000.00) from federal funds to the department of health 21 for purposes of providing temporary medical assistance to 22 pregnant women in accordance with this act for the period beginning [insert date here] and ending [insert date here]. 23 24 This appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds 25 remaining from this appropriation on [insert date here] 26 27 shall revert as provided by law. The department of health 28 shall include funding for this program in their next 29 biennial budget request.

The 6 7 cost for the next biennium is \$3.8 million from the general fund and \$3.8 million from federal funds. If the program is 8 to start immediately, the funding amount will have to be 9 adjusted to match that time period. 10 11 12 ***** 13 14 15 Section 4. The department of health shall promulgate 16 any rules necessary to implement this act. 17 18 Section 5. 19 20 (a) Except as otherwise provided by subsection (b) of 21 this section, this act is effective July 1, 2023. 22 23 (b) Sections 4 and 5 of this act are effective 24 immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a 25 bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of 26 the Wyoming Constitution. 27 28 ***** 29 30 STAFF COMMENT 31
