1 AN ACT relating to state officials; increasing the daily 2 salary rate for a legislator starting in the 69th 3 legislature; creating the independent commission on state official compensation; providing for appointment 4 of members; providing for terms of members on the commission; 5 providing for reports; providing an appropriation; and 6 7 providing for an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 Section 1. W.S. 9-3-201 is created to read: 11 12 ARTICLE 2 - STATE OFFICIALS COMPENSATION COMMISSION 13

4 (a) There is created the independent commission on 5 state officials compensation. The commission shall be comprised of seven (7) members appointed as provided in 6 this subsection. Members of the commission shall receive 7 8 per diem and mileage in the same amount as members of the legislature while attending meetings of the commission. 9 10 Except as provided in this subsection, members of the 11 commission shall serve six (6) year terms. Members of the 12 commission may serve no more than two (2) consecutive 13 terms. Of the initial members appointed to the commission three (3) members shall serve six (6) year terms, two (2) 14 members shall serve four (4) year terms and two (2) members 15 16 shall serve two (2) year terms. The governor, president of the senate, speaker of the house of representatives and 17 chief justice of the supreme court shall jointly determine 18 19 the terms of the initial members appointed to the 20 commission. If a member of the commission resigns, a new 21 member shall be appointed for the remainder of the 22 resigning member's term by the authority who appointed the resigning member. 1	qualified electors of the state of Wyoming and shall not
2	hold any office or employment with the state of Wyoming
3	while serving on the board. Members of the commission may
4	be removed by the members appointing authority as provided
5	in W.S. 9-1-202. Members of the commission shall be
6	appointed as follows:

8	(i) Three (3) members of the commission shall be
9	appointed by the governor;
10	
11	(ii) Two (2) members of the commission shall be
12	appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court;
13	
14	(iii) One (1) member of the commission shall be
15	appointed by the president of the senate;
16	
17	(iv) One (1) member of the commission shall be
18	appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.

20	(b) The commission shall meet at least twice during
21	every term of the legislature to receive all information
22	the commission deems relevant to determine the appropriate
23	salary recommendations to provide to the legislature. The

1 commission shall makes its recommendations as to the 2 appropriate salary to be provided to each official included 3 in subsection (d) of this section to the management council 4 of the legislature and the joint appropriations committee no later than December first of each odd numbered year. 5 6 7 When making recommendations to the management (C) 8 council and the joint appropriations committee for compensation adjustments pursuant to this section, the 9 10 commission shall consider any factors it considers 11 relevant, including: 12 13 (i) The level of compensation necessary to attract individuals qualified to serve to seek nomination 14 for the official positions; 15 16 17 (ii) The percentage average adjustment of 18 salaries provided to executive branch employees since the 19 last adjustment to an official's compensation; 20 21 (iii) The percentage change in the Wyoming cost-of-living index published by the economic analysis 22 23 division of the department of administration and

4 (iv) For a member of the legislature, the total 5 compensation necessary to promote a legislature that is 6 representative of the Wyoming electorate as a whole;

8 (v) For a justice of the supreme court, district 9 court judge, circuit court judge or district attorney, the 10 average market pay in Wyoming of an attorney qualified to 11 serve in those official positions.

13 (d) Pursuant to the requirements of the Wyoming 14 constitution and subsection (c) of this section, the 15 commission shall recommend a salary and other compensation 16 adjustments to the management council and the joint 17 appropriations committee for the following officials:

4 (d) Through January 11, 2027 each member of the 5 legislature shall receive one hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) per day as salary in addition to the mileage rate 6 provided for in this subsection. On and after January 12, 7 8 2027 each member of the legislature shall receive two hundred thirty dollars (\$230.00) per day as salary in 9 10 addition to the mileage rate provided for in this 11 subsection. Each member of the legislature may receive the 12 mileage rate provided for in this subsection for the total 13 round trip mileage from Cheyenne to the legislator's home for not more than one (1) trip each week during the period 14 the legislature is in session, provided the legislature is 15 16 in session for a period of not less than two (2) weeks and the legislator claiming the mileage reimbursement shall 17 submit a verified claim for mileage to the legislative 18 19 service office. Each member of the legislature shall 20 receive a mileage rate as established by the state auditor 21 to be reflective of the average of all direct and indirect 22 costs of driving a motor vehicle. In establishing the 23 mileage rate the state auditor:

2	Section 2. There is appropriated five thousand
3	dollars (\$5,000.00) from the general fund to the
4	legislative service office to pay for the per diem and
5	mileage for members of the state officials compensation
6	commission from the effective date of this act through June
7	30, 2024. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this
8	appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any
9	other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds
10	remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided
11	by law on July 1, 2024.

13	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2023.
