A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to public property and buildings; requiring
2	routine maintenance governance, planning and record keeping
3	for public buildings and facilities as specified;
4	specifying duties of the state construction department,
5	state building commission, community college commission,
6	school facilities commission and the board of trustees of
7	the University of Wyoming; allocating major maintenance
8	costs incurred as a result of neglected routine
9	maintenance; authorizing supplemental major maintenance
10	funding requests and recommendations; requiring reporting;
11	requiring rulemaking; and providing for effective dates.

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

1 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-3004(c) by creating a new 2 3 paragraph (x), 9-5-107(d)(iii), by creating new paragraphs 4 (v) and (vi) and by creating new subsections (j) and (k), 21-15-109(e), (f) and by creating a new subsection (g), 5 21-15-116(a) by creating a new paragraph (viii), 21-15-6 119(a)(i), 21-17-107, 21-17-204 by creating a new 7 8 subsection (d) and 21-18-225(b) by creating new paragraphs 9 (v) through (vii) and by creating a new subsection (n) are 10 amended to read: 11 12 9-2-3004. Duties of the department. 13 14 (c) The department shall: 15 16 (x) Review major maintenance expenditure 17 requests submitted by state agencies, community colleges 18 and the University of Wyoming. For school districts, the 19 department shall review major maintenance expenditures in 20 accordance with W.S. 21-15-109(e). For any component, 21 equipment or system of a building or facility that fails to reach its full life expectancy, the department shall 22

request and review the routine maintenance records for the

1	component, equipment or system. If the department
2	determines routine maintenance was not performed for the
3	component, equipment or system, the department shall
4	identify the component, equipment or system as neglected.
5	The department shall compare the service life of the
6	component, equipment or system at the time of failure to
7	the life expectancy of the component, equipment or system
8	and calculate the proportional cost of the component,
9	equipment or system that is attributable to neglected
10	routine maintenance. The department shall report all
11	neglected property and the costs attributable to neglected
12	routine maintenance to the state building commission,
13	community college commission, the University of Wyoming
14	board of trustees, the school facilities commission, the
15	select committee on school facilities and the joint
16	appropriations committee not later than September 1 of each
17	year.

Τ	(d) The state building commission shall adopt rules
2	implementing policies for the management of state
3	buildings. The rules shall establish:
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5	(iii) Requirements for planned development and

7	eliminate maintenance backlogs, and to establish proactive
8	maintenance practices and ensure that state buildings and
9	facilities and components, equipment and systems of state

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1 (j) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 2 costs of major building and facility repair of any 3 component, equipment or system of a state building or 4 facility that is attributable to neglected routine 5 maintenance, as determined by the state construction department under W.S. 9-2-3004(c)(x), shall be borne 6 7 entirely by the state agency that is assigned maintenance 8 of the building. 9 10 (k) To the extent the amount of funds appropriated in 11 any fiscal biennium pursuant to a formula adopted by the 12 state building commission for major building and facility repair and replacement are insufficient to replace a failed 13 component, equipment or system of a building or facility, 14 15 state building commission, the community college the 16 commission, the University of Wyoming or any agency may 17

Any supplemental funding appropriated in response to a budget request submitted under this paragraph or a budget recommendation submitted by the school

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12 (e) Amounts distributed under subsection (b) of this

13 section shall be deposited by the recipient district into a

14 separate account, the balance of which may accumulate from

15 year-to-year. Except as specified under subsection (f) of

16 this section and subject to subsection (g) of this section,

17 expenditures from the separate account, including any

18 interest earnings on the account, shall be restricted to

19 expenses incurred for major building and facility repair

20 and replacement as defined in subsection (a) of this

21 section and shall be in accordance with the district's

22 facility plan under W.S. 21-15-116. Account expenditures

23 may include the expenses of district personnel performing

1 work described under paragraph (a)(iii) of this section if 2 approved by the department and if documented within the 3 district's facility plan. The district's facility plan 4 shall clearly specify proposed major maintenance 5 expenditures for addressing district major building and facility repair and replacement needs on a building-by-6 building basis, updated for the applicable reporting 7 8 period, which shall be aligned to the statewide adequacy 9 standards and prioritized based upon the impact of the 10 building or facility on the district's ability to deliver 11 the required educational program. The district shall 12 include plans for maintaining any district building or 13 facility which is under a lease agreement, specifying lease revenues available to the district for maintenance of 14 15 facilities to the level required by statewide adequacy 16 standards. No expenditures shall be made from the separate 17 account unless the repair or replacement of the building or facility systems for which the expenditure is to be made is 18 19 clearly specified within the district's facility plan or 20 otherwise approved by the department. In a manner and form required by commission rule and regulation, each district 21 22 shall annually report to the department on the expenditures 23 made from the separate account during the applicable

1 reporting period, separating account expenditures on a 2 building-by-building basis. The department shall annually 3 review account expenditures and shall report expenditures 4 to the commission and the select committee on school facilities established under W.S. 28-11-301. The department 5 shall compile reported building-by-building expenditure 6 information for each district and the district facility 7 8 plan and include this information in its annual report to 9 the select committee pursuant to W.S. 21-15-121. 10 department shall request and review the routine maintenance 11 records for any component, equipment or system of a school building or facility for which funds are expended that 12 13 failed to reach its full life expectancy to determine if routine maintenance was performed. If any district expends 14 15 within account for funds the separate purposes 16 authorized by this subsection or by rule and regulation of 17 the commission, the payments for that district shall be reduced by the amount of the unauthorized expenditure in 18 19 the school year following the year in which the expenditure 20 was discovered or the school year in which notification was 21 provided by the department, whichever first occurs.

1	(f) Notwithstanding subsection (e) of this section
2	and subject to subsection (g) of this section, a district
3	may expend up to ten percent (10%) of the amount
4	distributed during any school year under subsection (b) of
5	this section for major building and facility repair and
6	replacement needs of the district which are not specified
7	in the district's facility plan, including expenditures for
8	maintenance of district enhancements. Expenditures shall
9	be made under this subsection only after the district's
10	building and facility repair and replacement needs
11	specified in its facility plan have been addressed in
12	accordance with subsection (e) of this section and the
13	department has approved the district's proposed
14	expenditures under this subsection. Amounts not expended
15	for purposes of this subsection during any school year may
16	be accumulated by a district and earmarked within the
17	separate account established under subsection (e) of this
18	section for expenditure under this subsection in subsequent
19	school years, provided the unexpended amount during any
20	school year to be accumulated does not exceed ten percent
21	(10%) of the amount distributed to the district under
22	subsection (b) of this section for that school year. Each
23	district shall include expenditures under this subsection

1 and any amounts accumulated from year-to-year under this 2 subsection within the annual report required under 3 subsection (e) of this section. Nothing in this subsection 4 shall prohibit or limit the application of subparagraph (c)(i)(D) of this section in computing a district's 5 building and facility gross square footage for purposes of 6 determining payment amounts under this section. 7 If any 8 school district exceeds expenditure limitations prescribed by this subsection or fails to comply with expenditure 9 10 levels for facility adequacy needs identified within its 11 facility plan, the payments for that district in the 12 immediately succeeding year shall be reduced by the excess expenditure amount including any excess expenditure of 13 amounts accumulated under this subsection. 14

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(g) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, no expenditure shall be made from the separate account established under subsection (e) of this section for the cost of major building and facility repair of any component, equipment or system of a school building or facility that is attributable to neglected routine maintenance as determined by the state construction department under W.S. 9-2-3004(c)(x). The payments for that

- 1 district shall be reduced by the costs attributable to
- 2 neglected routine maintenance in the school year following
- 3 the year in which the expenditure was identified by the

4 department.

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6 21-15-116. School district facility plans;

7 development, review and approval; plan criteria;

8 administrative review; collaborative committee process.

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10 (a) In accordance with rules and regulations of the commission, long range comprehensive school building and 11 12 facility plans for each school district shall be developed 13 by the department in coordination with the applicable district, which address district wide building and facility 14 needs. The facility plan shall identify building and 15 16 facility needs aligned with the statewide adequacy 17 standards, actions to remediate building and facility needs including construction, renovation and major building and 18 19 facility repair and replacement expenditures, and any local 20 enhancements to buildings and facilities beyond statewide 21 adequacy standards. The facility plan shall include a 22 response to each school building and facility need 23 identified on a building-by-building, space-by-space basis.

1 The plan shall also review, and to the extent practical, 2 identify and prioritize nonconstruction alternatives to school building and facility needs such as building 3 4 closure, modification of school boundaries, modification of 5 grade configurations and similar approaches. school Demolition or use, lease or other methods of disposition of 6 surplus buildings and facilities shall be incorporated as 7 8 part of the district plan, including the disposition of any existing land owned by the district. The plan shall not 9 10 include the abandonment or demolition of any school facility or building unless there has first been a public 11 12 hearing on the issue. The plan shall also 13 identified alternative methods of building disposition, proposed allocation of costs incurred or revenues resulting 14 from disposition and allocation of disposition revenues to 15 16 offset any costs paid by the department. In addition, 17 district facility plans shall include: 18 19 (viii) A plan for addressing school building and 20 facility routine maintenance needs. The routine maintenance

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plan shall:

1	(A) Be designed to eliminate maintenance

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21	(a) Notwithstanding W.S. $9-2-1012$, the commission
22	shall annually, not later than September 1, develop and
23	submit a recommended budget for projects and school capital

1 construction financing to the governor, through the state

2 budget department and to the select committee on school

3 facilities. The department shall prepare and provide

4 information as requested by the commission. The commission

5 shall include with its recommended budget to the select

6 committee the prioritized schedules of projects specified

7 in W.S. 21-15-117 including the amounts allocated to each

8 project and the annual building status report specified

9 under W.S. 21-15-121. The recommended budget submitted by

10 the commission shall include:

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5 (a) The legislature shall appropriate monies intended for the support and maintenance of the University of 6 Wyoming. The appropriations shall specify the purposes for 7 8 which the monies are intended and may be used. The 9 appropriations shall apply to and include all monies received by the university from the United States for the 10 11 endowment and support of colleges for the benefit of 12 agriculture and mechanic arts. No expenditure shall be made in excess of an appropriation, and no monies so 13 appropriated shall be used for any purpose other than that 14 15 for which they are appropriated.

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(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the costs of major building and facility repair of any component, equipment or system of a University of Wyoming building or facility that is attributable to neglected routine maintenance, as determined by the state construction department under W.S. 9-2-3004(c)(x), shall be entirely borne by the university.

20	facilities commission shall promulgate all rules necessary
21	to implement this act.

1	(b) The board of trustees of the University of Wyoming
2	shall promulgate all regulations necessary to implement
3	this act.

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7	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
8	section, this act is effective July 1, 2024.
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10	(b) Sections 2 and 3 of this act are effective
11	immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a
12	bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of
13	the Wyoming Constitution.
