Overview of the Business Division





- Largest single division of the Office of the Secretary of State
- 11 staff members, handling over 500,000 (and growing) filings annually
 - ~245k new & amendment filings, and ~257k annual reports as of 2023-05-10

• Responsible for the intake of more than \$36M annually

Overview of the Business Division



- Primary point-of-contact for small businesses getting started
- Provide the highest level of customer service as compared to the other 48 States' offices
 - Over 48,000 citizen phone calls annually
 - More than 1,500 face-to-face interactions annually
- Oversee & audit our Commercial Registered Agents

History of the LLC Act



- Wyoming passed the first groundbreaking LLC act on March 4th, 1977
- Hamilton Brothers Oil Company was looking for a way to more reasonably structure affairs, coupling the flexibility and tax treatment of a partnership, with the liability protection of a corporation
- Initially proposed in Alaska in 1975 & 1976, without success
- Introduced in Wyoming in 1977, and quickly passed with minimal dissent

History of the LLC Act

- The LLC remained unpopular for 11 years, as the innovation was not fully accepted by Washington & other States
- In 1988, the IRS formally recognized the LLC and accepted the partnership tax treatment it is now known for
- Further revisions in 1994 & 1996, as well as every other State following Wyoming's lead by 1996, finally cemented the LLC as the most used and most flexible corporate form for small and medium sized businesses





- 2023Q1 New business filings are up 33% vs 2022Q1 and 47% vs 2021Q1
- 2023Q1 Total Filings are up 18% vs 2022Q1 and 34% vs 2021Q1
- Revenues are also growing quickly
 - FY2022 Q1-Q3: \$24,208,472
 - FY2023 Q1-Q3: \$28,996,143 up ~19.5%
- The rate of growth is itself accelerating quickly

Takeaways



- Since 2016, each online initial filing had to be manually checked for name suitability
- This process grew to consume 4-6 hours of staff time each day
- New system employed as of May $1^{\rm st}$ 2023 has reduced that considerably
- The remarkable pace of growth opens opportunities for enhancing our team dynamics and leveraging advanced technology for efficiency.
