

Regulatory Reduction Taskforce

The purpose of the Regulatory Reduction Taskforce is to examine state programs that have: 1) regulatory primacy with the federal government or programs that are dictated by federal regulations; and 2) streamlining building codes. This shall be constrained by programs related to the minerals and agriculture sector and those statutes which impact building codes. Are state agencies regulating industry in a manner that exceeds the federal regulatory requirements or which unduly limits economic development in the state?

- Three Legislators from each house, chosen by the presiding officer. The presiding officers shall designate one member from their house to serve as co-chairman of the task force.
- Director of DEQ or designee
- Director of Department of Agriculture
- State Fire Marshal or his designee
- Governor Appoints:
 - 1) Member of PAW
 - 2) Member of Mining Association
 - 3) Member of WSGA or WWGA
- Outcomes
 - 1) Identify areas where Wyoming state agencies can reduce the regulatory burden for Wyoming's minerals and agricultural sectors.
 - 2) Identify any statutory solutions needed
 - 3) Report to the Governor and Management Council on their findings and any statutory changes identified. Recommendations can be made to the appropriate joint interim committees. Report shall be submitted by October 1, 2023.
- Work Schedule
 - 1) Three one day meetings. 1 ½ for exploration of minerals related regulations and a half day for agricultural related regulations. One day meeting for solutions.
- Staffing
 - 1) Task Force will be staffed by the LSO, with the assistance of DEQ and the Department of Ag.
