## A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to pari-mutuel wagering; authorizing
2	agreements and collection of fees for purposes of exporting
3	Wyoming horseracing simulcast signals out-of-state;
4	specifying a fee; and providing for an effective date.
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6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	<b>Section 1.</b> W.S. 11-25-201(b)(iii), (iv) and by
9	creating a new paragraph $(v)$ and by creating a new
10	subsection (n) is amended to read:
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12	11-25-201. Pari-mutuel permits; fees and reports;
13	disposition of funds; enforcement of provisions.

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2 (b) Every Wednesday following any pari-mutuel event,3 the permittee shall:

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5 (iii) Pay an amount equal to one percent (1%) of the total amount wagered attributable to historic pari-6 mutuel events, shown by the report to the commission, to be 7 8 transferred by the commission to the county and the city or 9 town in which the permittee is located, in equal shares, or 10 to the county alone if the permittee is not located within 11 the boundaries of a city or town. The county, city or town 12 receiving an amount under this paragraph may credit that 13 amount to the state fair account upon a majority vote of the county's, city's or town's governing body; and 14

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16 (iv) Pay an amount equal to one-quarter percent 17 (1/4%) of the total amount wagered attributable to historic 18 pari-mutuel events, shown by the report to the commission, 19 to be credited to the legislative stabilization reserve 20 account<u>;</u> and

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(v) Pay an amount equal to six percent (6%) of
the net proceeds of race meet revenues attributable to the

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- 1 interstate export of pari-mutuel simulcast signals, to be 2 credited to the general fund. 3 4 (n) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, 5 upon request by a permit holder to approve its interstate 6 export of pari-mutuel simulcast signals of covered race meets, the commission may enter into an agreement with any 7 8 entity that is responsible for administering the federal horseracing integrity and safety act of 2020, 15 U.S.C. 9 10 Sec. 3051 et seq., to provide services consistent with the 11 enforcement of the horseracing antidoping and medication 12 control program and the racetrack safety program. The commission may collect and remit fees assessed by the 13 entity to fund the state's proportionate share for the 14 15 horseracing antidoping and medication control program and racetrack safety program, as authorized by 15 U.S.C. Sec. 16 17 3052(f). 18 19 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2025. 20
