6	relating to preschools; providing definitions; providing a
7	penalty; making conforming amendments; specifying
8	applicability; requiring rulemaking; and providing for
9	effective dates.

16	The Committee may wish to consider amending the definitions
17	of "kindergarten ready" and "preschool."
18	
19	There are a few other states that provide a definition of
20	kindergarten readiness or school readiness including
21	Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, South Carolina, and West
22	Virigina. Here are a few examples:
23	
24	South Carolina (S.C. Code Ann. § 59-152-25)
25	(G) "School readiness" means the level of child
26	development necessary to ensure early school success as
27	measured in the following domains: physical health and
28 29	motor skills; emotional and social competence; language and literacy development; and mathematical thinking and
29 30	literacy development; and mathematical thinking and cognitive skills. School readiness is supported by the
31	knowledge and practices of families, caregivers, healthcare
32	providers, educators, and communities.

Louisiana (28 La. Admin. Code Part CLXVII. § 305)

- A. Children who are ready for kindergarten are expected to demonstrate:
- 4 1. cognitive abilities, which include knowledge and 5 skills in:
 - a. early literacy, such as phonological awareness, print concepts, alphabetic understanding, vocabulary, listening comprehension, and emergent writing;
 - b. basic numeracy concepts, such as rote counting and number awareness, sorting, classifying, comparing, patterning, and spatial relationships;
 - 2. basic science concepts, such as making observations, exploring the world using their senses, and using appropriate scientific vocabulary related to topics;
 - 3. basic social studies concepts, such as self awareness and their relationship to family and community, and an awareness of money and time;
 - 4. response to and participation in music, movement, visual and dramatic arts experiences and activities;
 - 5. abilities, either assisted or unassisted, that show an awareness of health, hygiene, and environmental hazards, in addition to gross and fine motor skills;
 - 6. social and emotional competencies, including self regulation, self-identity, self-reliance, respect for others, and interpersonal skills; and
 - 7. approaches to learning, such as reasoning and problem-solving, engagement, persistence, and eagerness to learn.

Other states have taken different approaches including:

- Setting indicators of readiness which are measured by a kindergarten entry assessment (Delaware, Illinois, North Carolina, Oregon, and Texas).
- Requiring the state education agency to set standards for school readiness (Connecticut and Florida).
- Authorizing the state board to adopt a definition of school readiness but sets minimum requirements for the definition (Colorado).

In Wyoming, W.S. § 21-4-302(e) requires school districts providing a preschool program to assess through the fourth grade, when practical, the school readiness and academic performance of students who participated in the preschool program as compared with those who did not. Before 2019,

school districts used the Instructional Foundations for 1 Kindergarten (IF-K), a kindergarten readiness assessment, 2 its students and reported these results to the Wyoming Department of Education through the 5 WDE453 kindergarten data collection. The WDE was then required to report these assessment results to the Joint 6 7 Education Interim Committee (JEC). In 2019 Wyoming Session Laws ch. 102, the Legislature removed the requirements that 8 the school districts report the results of the assessment 9 to the WDE and the WDE reports to the JEC. As a result, the 10 WDE ended the WDE453 data collection and subsequently no 11 12 longer funded the IF-K contract. W.S. 21-4-302(e) still requires that schools districts providing a preschool 13 program assess the school readiness of students but, school 14 15 districts may select their own assessment to meet this statutory assessment requirement. 16 ***************** 17

For the Committee's reference, a preschool would still be required to comply with the provisions of W.S. 14-4-101 through 14-4-111 addition to administering in readiness program. kindergarten Α preschool would be certified if a preschool administers a kindergarten readiness program and complies with the following standards outlined in W.S. 14-4-104(b) which is provided below:

W.S. 14-4-108 provides that any certification may be certifying suspended, nonrenewed, or revoked by the authority upon proof of violation of any provision of W.S.

STAFF COMMENT 11

> The Committee may wish to address how this act interacts with the Wyoming Education Savings Accounts (ESA) Act. The Wyoming ESA Act provides a definition of pre-kindergarten and requires the state superintendent of public instruction to establish a certification process for education service providers. The pre-kindergarten certification process must ensure "ESA students at a minimum receive instruction necessary for preparation to enter kindergarten." One policy option directed by Co-Chairman Scott is to require certification pre-kindergarten of education service providers by the department of family services under W.S. 14-4-101 through 14-4-111.
