To receive a career and technical education demonstration project grant under W.S. 21-12-105, school districts are not required to expend the entire amount generated under W.S. 21-13-309(m)(v)(D) for supplies, materials and equipment for career and technical education programs utilizing expenditure data from the immediately preceding five (5) school years from the date of application and amounts from the special reserve fund created under W.S. 21-13-504 for supplies, materials and equipment for career and technical education programs.

Additionally, W.S. 21-12-105 does not specify a preference in the award of funds.

20	later than August 15, 2024 under both programs, and that
21	will be awarded for school year 2025-2026.

awarded for a maximum period of two years. A delayed effective date that aligns with the next budget request may

avoid confusion for school districts awarded funds for

school year 2024-2025 and that plan on utilizing the two

years of funding available under the programs as the law is
