Hunting licenses-weighted bonus points system.

Sponsored by: Joint Travel, Recreation, Wildlife & Cultural Resources Interim Committee

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; establishing a weighted 2 bonus points program for ram bighorn sheep and moose hunting license random draws; removing the preference point 3 4 drawing for ram bighorn sheep and moose; providing for the 5 calculation of weighted bonus points; making conforming 6 amendments; repealing provision; specifying a 7 applicability; requiring rulemaking; and providing for 8 effective dates.
- 10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 23-1-302(p), 23-1-107(a), (b)(intro),
(iii), (h)(intro), (iii) and (j), 23-1-703(c), (g) and by
creating a new subsection (j), 23-1-705(a) and (k),
23-2-101(g), (k) and (m) and 23-2-109 are amended to read:

23-1-302. Powers and duties.

(p) The commission may, by rule and regulation,
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establish a process by which big game licenses, trophy game 9 10 licenses and wild bison licenses may be issued by a competitive raffle and prescribe the manner of payment for 11 12 which raffle chances are sold and the amount of payment for 13 each raffle chance. No more than two (2) licenses for each big game species and trophy game species and no more than 14 two (2) wild bison licenses shall be issued under this 15 16 subsection. Each license issued for bighorn sheep, moose, 17 mountain goat, grizzly bear or wild bison through a competitive raffle shall, when applicable, be counted 18 19 any nonresident quota. The five (5) year 20 restriction imposed on the receipt of a moose or bighorn 21 sheep license by W.S. 23-1-703(b) or and the lifetime restriction imposed on the receipt of a grizzly bear, 22 mountain goat, bighorn sheep, wild bison or moose license 23

1 by W.S. 23-1-703(c), and any restriction imposed on the

- 2 receipt of a wild bison license by W.S. 23-2-107 shall not
- 3 be applicable in any manner to a license issued pursuant to
- 4 this subsection. The commission shall issue licenses upon
- 5 receipt of the proper license fee by the successful
- 6 competitive raffle winner. Nothing in this subsection shall
- 7 authorize the issuance of a license to any person whose
- 8 privilege to procure, purchase or possess a license has
- 9 been suspended pursuant to this act or by operation of law.

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- 11 23-1-107. Residency for obtaining game and fish
- 12 licenses.

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- 14 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, to
- 15 qualify for any resident game and fish license, bonus
- 16 point, preference point, permit or tag issued under this
- 17 act, a person shall be domiciled in Wyoming for not less
- 18 than one (1) full year immediately preceding the date the
- 19 person applies for the license, bonus point, preference
- 20 point, permit or tag and shall not have claimed residency
- 21 in any other state, territory or country for any purpose
- 22 during that one (1) year period.

1 (b) Each person applying for a license, bonus point, 2 preference point, permit or tag under this act shall 3 establish his own residency status independently or as 4 provided in this subsection or subsection (g) of this section. A minor dependent shall qualify as a resident if: 5 6 7 (ii) His noncustodial parent qualifies as a 8 resident under this act and the minor is or will be 9 residing in this state with the noncustodial parent during 10 any portion of the calendar year in which the license, permit or stamp is to be used or in the case of a bonus 11 12 point or preference point the calendar year in which the 13 bonus point or preference point is to be assigned or 14 accumulated. 15 16 (h) An applicant shall provide proof of residency and 17 swear to an oath of residency when making application for, or attempting to purchase, a resident license, bonus point, 18 19 preference point, permit or tag under this act. License 20 selling agents and the department shall consider as 21 documentary evidence of residency any of the following:

1	(iii) A proof of residency statement on a form
2	provided by the department that has been completed and
3	signed by the applicant. Any active duty member of the
4	armed forces, his spouse or minor dependent of the active
5	duty member making application for or purchasing a resident
6	license, bonus point, preference point, permit or tag shall
7	be required to complete and submit the proof of residency
8	statement; or
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10	(j) The commission may promulgate rules and
11	regulations in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative
12	Procedure Act to ensure that only bona fide Wyoming
13	residents as defined in this act are issued resident game
14	and fish licenses, bonus points, preference points, permits
15	and tags.
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17	23-1-703. Limitation of number of certain licenses;
18	reservation of certain licenses; reservation of certain
19	unused licenses.
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21	(c) No person may apply for and receive more than one
22	(1) cow or calf moose or one (1) ewe or lamb bighorn sheep
23	license in any consecutive five (5) year period. Except as

1	provided in this subsection and subsection (f) of this
2	section or by rule of the commission, no person who is
3	issued a hunting license on and after July 1, 2022 for a
4	grizzly bear, or for a mountain goat, any moose or antlered
5	moose, any ram bighorn sheep, any bighorn sheep and any
6	wild bison, and no person who, on July 1, 2022, is subject
7	to the five (5) year restriction under this subsection (b)
8	of this section for a cow or calf moose or a ewe or lamb
9	bighorn sheep license, shall be eligible to apply for or
10	receive a hunting license for that particular species in
11	any future year. The commission may issue hunting licenses
12	to any person in future years when necessary for wildlife
13	management purposes to harvest grizzly bear, mountain goat,
14	ewe or lamb bighorn sheep or cow or calf moose. The
15	commission may issue hunting licenses to any person to
16	harvest cow or calf wild bison pursuant to W.S. 23-2-
17	107(f).

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(g) In addition to the authority granted under subsection (b) of this section, the commission may through rule and regulation develop and implement a preference point program for nonresident antelope, nonresident deer and nonresident elk licenses which are limited in quota and

1 would otherwise be issued through a random drawing. A 2 program established pursuant to this subsection may be 3 implemented for all or selected hunt areas and may be 4 applied to all or portions of licenses for any particular species antelope, deer and elk. The commission may charge 5 nonresident license applicants a nonrefundable fee to 6 accumulate preference points under the program as provided 7 8 in W.S. 23-2-101(m). 9 10 (h) Rules and regulations shall be promulgated by the 11 game and fish commission to carry out subsections (a) 12 through (f) and (j) of this section and may be promulgated as provided in subsection (g) of this section. 13 14 (j) Licenses issued under this subsection shall be 15 16 issued for moose and ram bighorn sheep through a weighted 17 bonus point random drawing. The department shall assign bonus points to each license applicant for a moose or ram 18 19 bighorn sheep by multiplying the number of years the 20 applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a moose or ram 21 bighorn sheep license times one (1). The department shall then square a license applicant's assigned bonus points to 22

determine the license applicant's total entry for the

1	weighted bonus point random drawing. A license applicant's
2	total number of weighted bonus points shall not accumulate
3	year to year and shall be recalculated each year based on
4	the license applicant's assigned bonus points. The
5	calculation used to assign bonus points to an applicant for
6	a moose or ram bighorn sheep under this subsection shall
7	include any year the applicant does not apply for a moose
8	or ram bighorn sheep license, provided in the case of a
9	resident the applicant pays the fee specified in W.S.
L O	23-2-101(k), and in the case of a nonresident, the
L1	applicant pays the appropriate fee established by the
L2	commission under W.S. 23-2-101(m). For purposes of
L3	assigning bonus points under this subsection, any
L4	unsuccessful license applicant failing to apply for a
L5	license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of applying,
L6	during the second calendar year shall be considered to be a
L7	first year applicant for any subsequent calendar year in
L8	which the applicant submits a license application for a
L9	moose or ram bighorn sheep. All available licenses issued
20	under this subsection within any hunt area shall be
21	randomly selected through a weighted bonus point drawing
22	where each applicant has a number of entries equal to the

- 1 applicant's number of weighted bonus points until all
- 2 available licenses have been issued.

- 4 23-1-705. Complimentary licenses; pioneer licenses;
- 5 antelope hunt licenses; gunpowder and buckskin hunt
- 6 licenses; gratuitous licenses; donated licenses.

- 8 (a) At the request of the governor, the commission
- 9 shall annually issue up to twenty-five (25) complimentary
- 10 hunting and twenty-five (25) complimentary fishing
- 11 licenses. Not more than five (5) bighorn sheep, five (5)
- 12 moose and five (5) wild bison licenses shall be issued
- 13 under this subsection. The five (5) year restriction
- 14 imposed on the receipt of a moose, bighorn sheep or wild
- 15 bison license by W.S. 23-1-703(b) and (c) W.S. 23-1-703(c),
- 16 and any restriction imposed on taking of wild bison under
- 17 commission rule and regulation shall not be applicable in
- 18 any manner to a license issued pursuant to this subsection.
- 19 Except as provided under subsection (g) of this section, no
- 20 complimentary licenses may be issued at the request of the
- 21 appointed commissioners. Immediately upon issuance of any
- 22 of these licenses, the commission shall submit to the
- 23 secretary of state for maintenance as a public record, the

1 name and address of each licensee and the type of license

2 issued.

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4 The holder of any valid big game animal license, trophy game animal license, any wild bison license or a 5 female or calf wild bison license may surrender said 6 license to the department for reissuance to a veteran with 7 8 disabilities or a person with a permanent disability who 9 uses a wheelchair as established by commission rule and 10 regulation selected and sponsored by a nonprofit charitable 11 organization providing hunting opportunities to a veteran 12 with disabilities or a person with a permanent disability 13 who uses a wheelchair. Any license reissued in accordance with the provisions of this subsection shall be for the 14 15 same species, area and license type as the license donated. 16 The license shall be reissued by the department to a 17 qualifying person at no fee. Any license donated and 18 reissued under the provisions of this subsection shall not 19 be sold, traded, auctioned or offered for any monetary 20 value and shall not be issued to, or used by, any person 21 other than a qualifying person under the provision of this with commission rule 22 section and in compliance and 23 regulation. Licenses reissued to persons pursuant to this

1	subsection shall not be subject to residency, drawing or
2	fee requirements under W.S. 23-2-101 or 23-2-107. The five
3	(5) year restriction imposed on the receipt of a cow or
4	calf moose or a ewe or lamb bighorn sheep license by W.S.
5	23-1-703(b), and the lifetime restriction imposed on the
6	receipt of a grizzly bear, mountain goat, ram or any
7	bighorn sheep, any wild bison or any moose or antlered
8	moose license by W.S. 23-1-703(c) or the restrictions
9	imposed on a wild bison under W.S. 23-2-107(f) shall not be
10	applicable in any manner to a license issued pursuant to
11	this subsection.

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17 (g) In promulgating rules and regulations for the
18 taking of bighorn sheep and moose, the commission shall not
19 discriminate between residents and nonresidents regarding
20 the maturity and horn size of the animals which may be
21 taken. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed as
22 prohibiting the commission from issuing a different number
23 of licenses for residents and nonresidents, from requiring

a bonus point or preference point fee from nonresidents 1 2 only pursuant to subsection (m) of this section or from 3 issuing reduced price ewe and lamb bighorn sheep licenses 4 as provided in subsection (d) of this section. 5 Any resident qualified to purchase a moose or ram 6 bighorn sheep hunting license under subsection (j) of this 7 8 section may pay a fee of seven dollars (\$7.00) in lieu of 9 applying for a moose or ram bighorn sheep hunting license. 10 Payment of the fee for a particular species under this 11 subsection shall authorize the person to accumulate be assigned bonus points for the purposes of the weighted 12 bonus point drawing under  $\overline{W.S.}$  23-1-703(b)  $\overline{W.S.}$  23-1-703(j) 13 14 that year in the same manner as if he for had 15 unsuccessfully applied for a hunting license for that 16 species. Payment of the fee shall be made in compliance 17 with application dates. 18 19 Subject to the provisions of this subsection, as 20 part of any bonus point program for nonresident ram bighorn sheep or nonresident moose and any preference point program 21 for nonresident antelope, nonresident ram bighorn sheep, 22

nonresident moose, nonresident deer or nonresident elk, the

1 commission may establish a nonrefundable fee to be either 2 withheld from the license fee remitted or submitted 3 separately when application for a license, bonus point or 4 preference point is made through electronic licensing, and may also establish a fee to be paid in lieu of applying for 5 licenses that are limited in quota. Retention of the 6 established fee or payment of the fee in lieu of applying 7 8 shall authorize the person to accumulate a be assigned a bonus point or to accumulate a preference point for future 9 10 drawings for licenses that are limited in quota for the 11 species in accordance with rules applicable of the 12 commission. The rules may provide for the loss of 13 assigned bonus points or accumulated preference points for 14 persons failing to apply or to pay the in lieu fee in two 15 (2) consecutive calendar years. The fee for any preference 16 points program under this subsection for antelope, deer or 17 elk shall be established by rule and shall not exceed seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) per species. Payment of the 18 19 fee shall be made in compliance with application dates. 20 Nothing in this subsection authorizes the commission to establish or retain a fee for resident moose or resident 21 ram bighorn sheep <del>license preference bonus</del> points 22 addition to the fee established by subsection (k) of this 23

1	section or to establish rules for ram bighorn sheep or
2	moose <del>preference</del> <u>weighted bonus</u> point <u>random</u> drawings in
3	conflict with the provisions of $\frac{W.S.}{23-1-703(b)}$ $\frac{W.S.}{23-1-703(b)}$
4	703(j). For nonresident ram bighorn sheep and nonresident
5	moose licenses, the commission may establish by rule a
6	nonrefundable <del>preference</del> bonus point fee to be withheld
7	from either the license fee remitted or submitted
8	separately when application for a license or preference
9	bonus point is made through electronic licensing and may
10	establish a fee in lieu of making application in an amount
11	greater than that established under subsection (k) of this
12	section, but neither fee shall exceed one hundred fifty
13	dollars (\$150.00). Fees established under this subsection
14	may be set at lower amounts for youth license applicants.

## 23-2-109. Multiple applications for limited licenses prohibited; penalty.

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Except as otherwise authorized by law or rule of the commission, no person shall submit more than one (1) application for a license for the same big or trophy game species or for wild turkey, if the issuance of the license has been limited by the commission. A violation of this

- 1 subsection shall be punishable as a high misdemeanor
- 2 punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(ii), by the loss
- 3 of all points then assigned to the person pursuant to W.S.
- $\frac{23-1-703(b)}{(g)}$  or  $\frac{(g)}{(g)}$  W.S.  $\frac{23-1-703(g)}{(g)}$  or  $\frac{(j)}{(g)}$ , and
- 5 disqualification in the year of submission for any license
- 6 for the species for which the multiple applications were
- 7 submitted.

**Section 2.** W.S. 23-1-703(b) is repealed.

 This bill draft repeals W.S. 23-1-703(b) which was the previous section providing for the preference points program, and instead incorporates the new bonus points program in the new subsection (j) created earlier in this draft. For reference, W.S. 23-1-703(b) reads:

(b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, no person may apply for and receive more than one (1) cow or calf moose or one (1) ewe or lamb bighorn sheep license in any consecutive five (5) year period. Licenses issued under this subsection shall be issued partially through a preference point drawing and partially through a random drawing of all remaining unsuccessful applicants for that year. The department shall assign points to each license applicant for a specific species by multiplying the number of years the applicant has unsuccessfully applied for a license times one (1). The calculation used to assign points to an applicant for a particular species under this subsection shall include any year the applicant does not apply for a big or trophy game animal hunting license for that species, provided in the case of a resident the

applicant pays the fee specified in W.S. 23-2-101(k), and 1 in the case of a nonresident, the applicant pays the 2 appropriate fee established by the commission under W.S. 3 23-2-101(m). License applicants within each hunt area for a 5 species shall be grouped according to the number of 6 assigned points for that species. Not less than seventy-7 five percent (75%) of available licenses within any hunt area shall be randomly selected through a preference point 8 drawing from among the group of applicants with the largest 9 number of assigned points and shall continue until all 10 applicants within that group have been exhausted or until 11 all available licenses have been issued, whichever first 12 13 occurs. If any applicant grouping has been exhausted and 14 licenses remain available within that hunt area, selection 15 shall continue from among the group of applicants with the largest number of assigned points. After the 16 17 selections through the preference point drawing have been 18 completed within a hunt area, the remaining licenses available from that drawing and the licenses available for 19 20 the random drawing for that hunt area will be issued through a random selection from among all applicants in the 21 22 hunt area who were not selected for issuance of a license 23 for the species through the preference point drawing in that hunt area. For purposes of assigning points under this 24 25 subsection, any unsuccessful license applicant failing to 26 apply for a license, or pay the applicable fee in lieu of applying, during the second calendar year shall 27 28 considered to be a first year applicant for any subsequent 29 calendar year in which the applicant submits license 30 application for that particular species.
