#### Budget Model

• By Choice – removed from UW budget model

Operation budget - 100% private donation Director position - funded by UW Project Coordinator, Sr – funded by donor x 3 years

- Allows future allocation of funding
- Facilitates partnerships and collaborations with campus/off-campus services and programs

#### Student Demographics

- 692 military connected students
  - 440 Male // 220 Female
  - 530 benefits // 162 without benefits
  - Age Range: 17yrs 78 yrs; Avg Age Freshman 26 yrs
  - **127 Graduates this semester**
  - **Average fall semester: 130 150 new/transfer students**
- 184 Dependents utilizing benefits (some could be military members)
  - Post 9/11: 87 Chap 35 DEA: 97
- 100 WY National Guard utilizing NG Tuition Assistance Benefits

#### Success and Results

• Veterans Services Center

2,100 sq ft private center, fall 2018 Student Use: Appx 86 per day, 6800 per semester, over 13,000 hits per year

- Staffing: 2 FTE Staff, 8 VA Work Study Student Veterans, 3 Student Tutors, 2 Adjunct Professors
- 60 activities/events per academic year



#### Success and Results

- 6 academic courses providing tools for student success, employability, and community integration
- Providing VA/Federal/State education benefits briefing to WY ARNG –ETS/Ret/Deploying
  - Upcoming for WAY ARNG 2/300 Soldiers
- Create opportunities to provide localized support by VA, VetCenters, WY Veterans Commission, on/off-campus organizations
- Food Insecurity Program fed 2200 meals to student veterans; participate in various mental and physical wellness programs: Veterans Talking to Veterans, Lethal Means Safety Programming, Governors Challenge on Veteran Suicide, Wyoming Hunger Initiative
- Increased military connected student enrollment by 36% since 2020 to all time high of 692 this past semester.

#### Success and Results

- Degree program exploration
- Increased numbers of student veterans utilizing mental and physical wellness programs, launched Buddy Check Woobie Program
- Developed WY Veterans in Higher Education Conference UW, WY Community Colleges, Other Academic and Voc/Tech Schools
- Added a military family scholarship, total of 10 Veteran scholarship opportunities totaling \$191,400
- Maintaining female military connected students at 30% of population, added Women Veterans Program; increase in number of dependents using parent's VA GI Bill
